## DELEGATES TO CONVENTION LEFT BIG SUM IN THE CITY

Conservative Estimates Place the Number of Visitors at 3,000 and the Amount Spent at \$40,000.

Denver profited financially by the recent Sunday school convention. It is conservatively estimated that the delegates and other visitors to the convention left in the neighborhood of from \$35,000 to \$40,000 in the pockets of hotel and restaurant proprietors and merchants.

WAS A CROWD OF THEM. Entertainment was provided by the local committee for over 1,300 delegates. Of this number homes were opened for 1,180 persons and in boarding houses places were provided for 115 persons. This free entertainment was only for lodging and breakfast, and the delegates "hustled" for their own lunch and dinner.

In addition to the 1,300 persons provided for by the entertainment committee members provided for their own entertainment. "A conservative estimate of the number

here during the convention," said W. M. Danner, chairman of the entertainment committee, "is nearly 3,000."

HOTELS DID A GOOD BUSINESS. At the various hotels the proprietors were all well pleased as a result of the convention. The general expression was: "The visitors were as fine a class of people as we ever met, and they were good spenders."

The brown Palace hotel entertained nearly 125 delegates, who paid their own expenses, averaging at least \$5 a day, thus bringing into the hotel \$625 daily for a week. At the other hotels, the Albany, the Albert, the Metropole and uptown houses, the story was told. The delegates wanted the best rooms and were tractable. The restaurant men above Street profited chiefly by the convention because of their proximity to Trinity church.

## ENTERTAINED BY SHAMROCKS.

MONTREAL, July 7.—The New Westminster lacrosse team was entertained at supper to-night by the Shamrocks. The new Westminster's share of the gate receipts of the two matches was about \$1,500. The expenses of the team were about \$3,000.

## INTENSIVE FARMING.

The English farmer has been compelled by his limitation to study intensive farming and he practises it more generally than our own husbandman do. As a rule he understands gardening much better and has a higher respect for that branch of the industry. Yet market gardening is more and more the dependable quality in New England agriculture. If a few hundred Englishmen want to try their hands at it here we should say they might be welcomed and encouraged. —Boston Transcript.

## AFTER CYCLE COMPANY.

TORONTO, July 7.—Another action has been entered against the directors of the Cycle Company by dissatisfied stockholders. G. W. Biddell, on behalf of himself and others, is suing for cancellation of agreement under which the National Company was taken over by the Canadian Company. The amount involved is \$239,000.

## CONSUMPTIVES' SANITARIUM

MONTREAL, July 6.—The new free consumptives hospital, of the national sanitarium, was opened here on Saturday afternoon by Sir William Meredith, chief justice of Ontario.

## 300 MEN OUT OF WORK.

PERTH, July 6.—The blacksmith shop, machine shop, oil house, office and four box cars of the Canadian Pacific here were burned this morning. Three hundred men are thrown out of work. Night Watchman Roland Burr is missing. He was last seen entering the blacksmith shop while it was in flames.

## MOB DESTROYS PAWTUCKET CARS.

PAWTUCKET, R. I., July 6.—This afternoon two cars of the Pawtucket system were surrounded in Lincoln by a crowd of 500. The crews were forced to abandon the cars. The crowd cut the curtains with knives, rung the fare registers to the limit, broke the ventilator windows and battered the woodwork.

## GENERAL REPORTED DEAD IS ALIVE.

Port of Spain, Island of Trinidad, July 5.—The report circulated of the death of General Domingo Lemous, one of the leading chiefs in the matos revolution against President Castro, has been proving to be false. The rumor, it is believed, was spread from the purpose of disheartening the revolutionists in Venezuela.
