...GLENCORODALE.—There is considerable grain out in stock. Practically nothing could be done last week.—Mathias Dunphy left for the Maine woods, Friday.—The Ford family, of South Lake, have moved into this settlement, Percy Ford, a returned man, purchased the R.H. McDonald farm here, under terms of the Soldiers' Settlement, a few weeks ago, and is busy fixing up the place and harvesting the crop. During the past week he had the farm surveyed.—John Dunphy, blacksmith, is kept busy at the anvil though nearly twenty years of age, he keeps up with the work.—German guns appear to have followed Mr. Percy Ford from Flanders' fields while getting his recently purchased farm surveyed during the week the surveyors' chain and plumb line were out of the line, and a diligent search all afternoon, by the surveying party failed to locate it. Next day, however, the chain was found hidden in the woods, Surveyor McDonald, Hermanville, owned the chain.—Mr. Joseph Parsons, well-known has been working this settlement for the past two weeks deepening and cleaning the wells, which were dried up. He succeeded in getting permanent water in every case.

...TOWN COUNCIL.—The regular quarterly meeting of this Board of Trade was held in the Council Chamber of the town of Montague, P. E. I. on Monday afternoon the 20th. Inst. at 4 o'clock p.m. and after the usual business was disposed the following report of the Board of Trade at the coming conference in Amherst on the 29th. Inst. of the Maritime Boards of Trade, S. C. Knight, President; Central King's Board of Trade, Georgetown, John A. MacDonald, 1st. Vice Pres., Cardigan, W. L. Poole, 2nd. Vice Pres., Montague, J. Howard MacDonald, Georgetown. The above delegation was instructed to press the matter of the widening of the gauge on the island at those points where the work has not yet been completed but more especially east of Charlottetown, the placing of the second car ferry between the ports of Picton, N. S. and Georgetown, P. E. I. and improved railway service and freight accommodations at those points where such service is at present inadequate, and to cooperate with the other Boards of Trade on the Island and elsewhere in such projects as they consider would be beneficial to this province in particular and the Maritime Provinces in general.

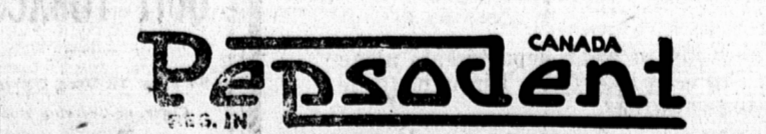
