FOR PURE ELECTIONS.

Rev. Dr. Chown of the temperance and moral reform department of the Methodist church believes that reform should begin at the top, and therefore urged upon Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Mr. Borden the Opposition leader that their influence should be energetically exercised to secure an observance of law and propriety in the coming elections.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier in his reply to Rev. Dr. Chown wrote in part as follows: "I think that I can claim that my position has always been one of absolute hostility to anything that tends to the lower standard of public life in Canada, and on many occasions I have placed these views on record."

Mr. Borden's reply was perhaps a little more pointed and definite: "Let me say that I shall be most happy to co-operate with you and your friends in the good work which you are carrying on."

It is most earnestly to be hoped that all candidates will follow the example of their leaders in this matter. Fortunately both the party leaders in federal politics are men of clean and reputable lives and we may credit what they say when they express a desire for pure and honest elections.

Every candidate, election worker and elector should read, mark and inwardly digest the "warning to electors" printed in the advertising columns of this issue. Let us this time have an honest election, and bring to justice any and every one who violates or attempts to violate the election law.

It is evident that at the coming election there will be a stronger effort than before to restrain the corrupting agencies that have heretofore disgraced our elections, and that it will be made more dangerous than it was in previous elections to make corrupt use of money or intoxicating liquors.
