After the evidence for the Crown had been submitted the Chief-Justice withdrew the case from the jury as there was practically no evidence whatever against the prisoner. In both cases Neil McLeod conducted the case for the Crown while McQuarrie, K. C., looked after the prisoner's interests. This morning the case for slander of Martha Jeanette McCallum vs. Geo. Bowness will be taken before the Chief-Justice and a jury. This case will be tried before closed doors.
