It is important that the full text of the agreement made by the Provincial Government with the promoters of the Dominion Packing Company should be given to the public at once. On behalf of the people we call for its production. It is bad enough, inexcusable in fact, that any compact should have been entered into behind the backs of the people, touching a matter in which they all are so vitally concerned.

Dr. Adolph Lorenz of Vienna, said to be the most eminent surgeon in the world, was brought to Charlottetown by Philip Armour, to perform an operation on a child of the great millionaire. After the little one had been attended to and Dr. Lorenz had pocketed a fee of \$150,000, the king of surgeons visited several Chicago hospitals and performed similar operations gratis on half a dozen poor children.

A SUSPICIOUS PROPAGANDA.

What interest have three or four Montreal lawyers or Armour's salesman in the welfare of the people of P. E. Island? Was it for our good or for their own profit that they sent their emissaries hither to exploit our meat-packing, canning and cold storage possibilities? To ask these questions is to answer them. The agents of the scheme came to us uninvited. Our Government were having no particular anxiety as to pork-packing at that time.

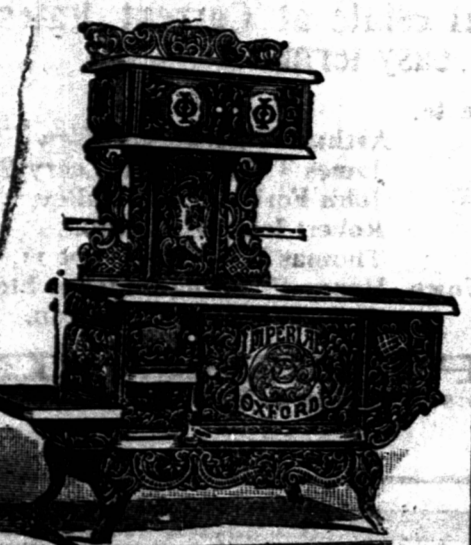
The emissaries met some leading members of the Government, and apparently captured them at sight. Possibly they may have wired to their principals after the meeting, in the language of Caesar, "We came, saw and conquered." It was all so easily and so quickly accomplished! An agreement was made and an Order in Council passed before the dear people were even aware that the agents of the great enterprise had been in our midst.

But the local promoters held on to their propaganda. They suddenly affected the deepest possible interest in pork-packing, canning, cold storage and the welfare of the people! They saw that the people were opposed, and they redoubled their efforts. Why are certain gentlemen whom we could name and the Patriot newspaper so suddenly and intensely interested in carrying through this particular scheme? Our wants were much the same three months ago, but then these gentlemen and the Patriot were well content to let matters go on as they were.

The prohibitory act of Ontario is to be submitted to the people by referendum on December 4 next, five or six weeks hence. Already the campaign is becoming quite active and interesting. The Presbyterian and the Christian Guardian, the latter speaking for the Methodist body, are doing valiant service in behalf of the good cause prohibition. A pleasing feature in connection with the Tartre episode is the promptness of a decision with which Sir Wilfrid acted. Though called to deal with one who had been of great assistance to him, with a very influential lieutenant, kindred in race and religion, he took the strictly constitutional view of the matter at issue and did not hesitate to call for Mr. Tartre's resignation. It required courage and decision of character to do this and Sir Wilfrid has many times shown that he is not wanting in these admirable qualities.
