Hanratty And Bleakney To Stand Trial

OTTAWA, Oct. 4.—(CP)—Magistrate Glenn Strike today ordered the two key figures in Ottawa's outbreak of veterans' housing seizures to stand trial on a charge of forcibly seizing and detaining government property, namely H. M. C. S. Carleton, a former sailor and wren's barracks slated to be used as an instructional block for reserve sailors. In a courtroom crowded with sympathizers for the accused, he announced that he would formally commit next Wednesday afternoon the two men to the Ottawa Jail. Hanratty, a former air observer, and George Bleakney, an Ottawa lawyer who emerged as legal counsel for Hanratty's veterans' housing league shortly after it embarked on its campaign to take over buildings for veterans in need of adequate shelter.
