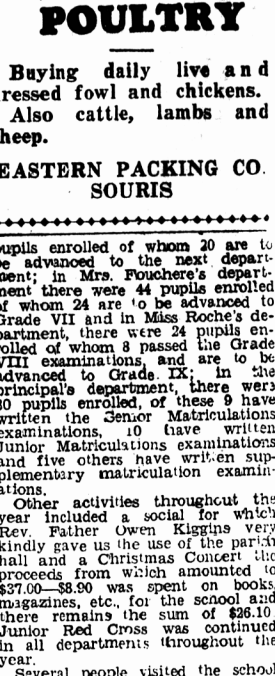

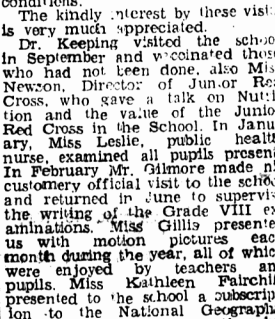

KEEP POULTRY CONFINED

Keeping the farm poultry flock confined to a clean house and a sanitary sun pen is one of the most important requirements to keep the flock healthy. Not only is poultry but in hogs as well says W. M. Vernon, extension poultry specialist at Iowa State College. Specializing poultrymen and leading farm poultry producers, he says, have been following this practice for many years. It is so satisfactory that allowing the hens to range over the barn lots, post-culling of the flock, and the spreading of disease over the farmstead and of avian tuberculosis to hogs.
