MORGEN BUYS THE MOST VALUABLE LOT IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Feb. 20.—The firm of J. P. Morgan & Co., will soon begin work on a new skyscraper office building to replace their present headquarters at the corner of Wall and Nassau streets.

It is said that the firm has just completed the purchase of property with a frontage of 83 feet in Wall street and 113 feet in Broad street which has heretofore been in the hands of the Drexels. The plot is considered the most valuable piece of its size in New York.

Real estate men estimate its market value at nearly \$1,000 a square foot. At \$1,000 a square foot it would be worth about \$9,000,000. Anthony Drexel bought a part of it in 1872 for \$250,000.

TRYING TO AVERT BRITISH COAL MINERS' STRIKE. LONDON, Feb. 19.—Various conferences were held today in connection with the threatened coal strike throughout the United Kingdom, but the developments were of minor importance, except that the national transport workers' federation decided to support the miners in the event of a strike.

It is believed that a cabinet council will be held tomorrow to consider the situation. It is likely that the government, if independent efforts at conciliation fail, will call a conference of representatives of the masters and the men, at which Geo. R. Askwith, the "lord of trade" "strike-breaker," will preside.

FINDS DOG-FADE. BIRD-BEAKED MEN. LOS ANGELES, Feb. 20.—Dr. Carl Kumm, African explorer and scientist, arrived here today en route to Washington, where he will lay evidence before the heads of the National Geographical Society that he has discovered men with the faces of dogs and of birds living in the heart of the "Dark Continent."

"I have proof," declared Dr. Kumm, "that I have found negroes with the faces of dogs. They spoke in a low guttural bark not unlike that of the canine. They live by clans and their mode of life is not unlike that of the stone age."

"In another part of Africa, far from the haunts of white men, I discovered a tribe of negroes who ran about like storks on one leg. Their other leg was never used and they kept it bent up or drawn taut. These men live in a section of the country where there are many pools and ponds of water.

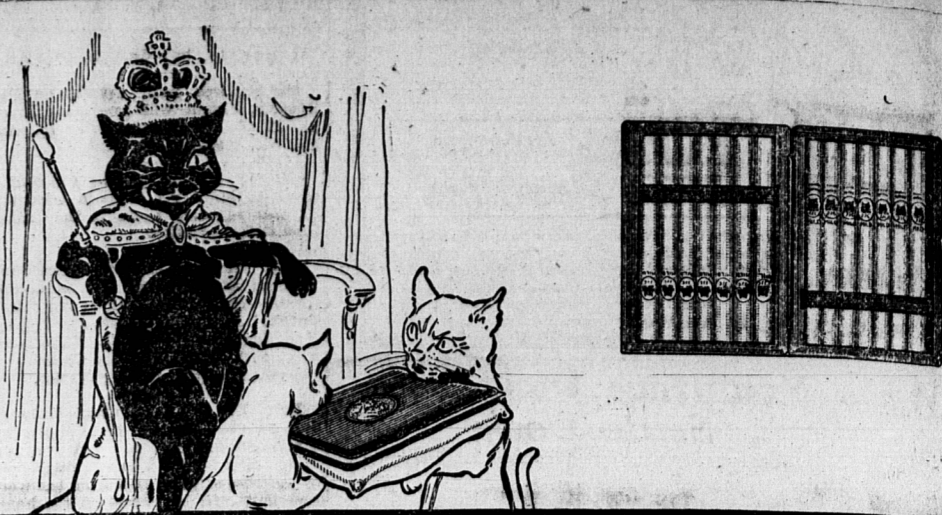
