THE CONFERENCE.

THE inter-provincial conference at Ottawa has thrown some valuable light on the political situation in Canada. It has shown us for one thing where the provinces stand on matters affecting stability as differentiated from matters of political expediency.

Notes by the Way

POLITICIANS and newspapers in the United States are much interested in the search for candidates who would be likely to carry their respective party conventions which are to be held next year to nominate candidates for the Presidency.

The Democratic party's most popular choice, at least until recently, had been Governor Al. Smith, of New York. Now a rival has come to the front in the person of Senator James M. Reed, of Missouri.

Both Republicans and Democrats show a disposition to avoid making the liquor question in any way a feature of their platforms or in the election campaign. Both parties are hopelessly divided between "wet" and "dry" in their membership.

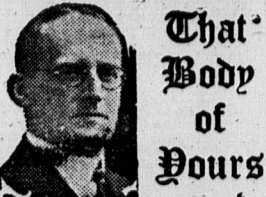
The Republican party seems to be threatened with a split in its ranks. A Western faction is disposed to revolt against the dominance of the East in the party councils. Senator Borah, of Idaho, along with Senator Norris, of Nebraska, Nye, of North Dakota, and Brookhart, of Iowa, are named as leaders in a movement to nominate Senator Norris, not with the hope of making him the choice of the national convention, but as a means of solidifying the strength of Western Republican farmers within the party and commanding respect for their legislative demands.

The Conference of Premiers at Ottawa so far as its discussions have been disclosed, has not given much support to Premier King's pet project of Senate Reform. The radical element in Parliament which is promoting the humiliation of the Senate is apparently equally desirous that the Canadian parliament shall obtain full power to amend the British North America Act at will and to cut off all appeals from the Supreme Court of Canada to the Privy Council in England.

The Conference has brought the promoters of these revolutionary projects into the open and unmasked their designs. That is of itself a desirable thing. What is better is that it has demonstrated the strength of the patriotic opposition in the five provinces east of the Lakes to every one of the radical and disturbing measures above referred to.

It is freely stated that not 12 of the 24 Liberal members of the Provincial Legislature are "dry" in the sense of being total abstainers from intoxicating liquors as a beverage. We do not know that such is the case, and any credible evidence to the contrary would be of interest and worthy of public consideration.

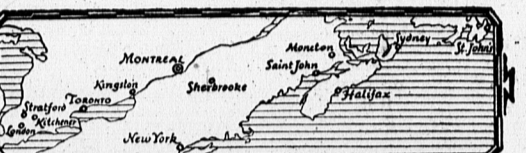
