OPENING OF THE RUSSIAN PARLIAMENT

Opened Amidst Scenes of Magnificent Splendor—Emperor Delivers His Message to Russian Millions—Count Witte a Pathetic Figure Among the Throng.

St. Petersburg, May 10.—As the strains of the national hymn, played by an orchestra in a far-off gallery, announced the starting of the imperial procession, three raps of the chamberlain's stave on the floor stilled the assembly into instant silence.

A magnificent scene for foreign eyes, semi-barbaric, headed by two masters of ceremonies, in gorgeous uniforms stiff with gold, then appeared. Before them walked two grooms and three court heralds with gold-tipped wands. Then, like a phalanx came a resplendent array of court dignitaries and officials, all with their breasts covered with decorations, their places in the procession being in inverse order of rank. Following them, escorted by twelve tall grenadiers in bearskin shakos, under the command of two guard officers with drawn sabres, six high dignitaries bore the emblems of the sovereignty of the house of Romanoff, the seal of the empire, the imperial standard, the sword of state, with its long, straight blade, borne point up; the orb and the sceptre and the glittering imperial crown, in the order named.

EMPEROR WALKS ALONE.
Half a dozen paces in the rear of the emperor, walking alone, advanced easily, holding himself erect, and evidently stealing himself for the ceremony. He was dressed in the simple blue uniform of a colonel in the Preobojensky regiment of the guards, with half-length boots, and his only decorations were the scarlet ribbon of the Alexander Nevsky order across his breast and the diamond star of the St. Andrew order. He carried his military cap in his left hand.

At an interval of two paces came Baron Fredericks and two special aides-de-camp, and then the two empresses, the place of honor being accorded the dowager empress, and the other members of the imperial family, with the exception of the tsar's heir to the throne, Grand Duke Alexis Nicolaievitch, and the daughters of the Emperor, followed in their order of procession to the throne.

GLAD IN COURT COSTUME.
The empresses were clad in court costume, the ancient Russian dress, composed of flowing, long-trained robe over a white silk skirt, and wearing on their heads the kokoshnik, or high Russian head-dress, embroidered with pearls and diamonds. The train of the dowager empress was white and edged with dark fur, as a token of her widowhood. That of the empress was embroidered with gold. The young empress wore diamonds and the dowager empress pearls.

In the train of the imperial family came the matrons and maids of the royal house, in the same style of costume but with overdresses of deeper color, the matrons of honor wearing green velvet and the maids of honor carried with gold brocade.

Behind these followed a long line of the wives and daughters of the noblest families of Russia, whose robes were of silk of varied light colors, blue, pink, rose and white.

The emperor halted in the center of the hall, and the metropolitan advanced to meet him, and held out the cross which his majesty reverently kissed. When his majesty bent forward the emperor clasped the hand of the metropolitan, raised it to his lips and kissed it, the metropolitan returning the salutation.

The empresses, who had in the meantime advanced and taken their places on either side of the emperor, greeted the sacred emblem and the representative of the church in the same manner, after which the bearers of the insignia of state, having advanced to the steps of the throne, deposited the emblems of sovereignty on cushions resting on the dais on each side of the throne, and the imperial family and courtiers having fallen slightly back, the emperor and the two empresses left standing in an isolated group during the celebration of the te deum, which followed.

All eyes turned on the emperor, who bore himself proudly erect, joining in the te deum by crossing himself and making frequent responses.

ALONE IN CENTER OF HALL.
At the close of the te deum the clergy roared, chanting, towards the palace chapel, and the empresses moved up the throne, while the grand dukes moved forward and occupied the three lower steps on the same side. The metropolitan, the emperor's private chaplain, the members of the holy serod, the master of the imperial household and the special aide-de-camp took their places at the foot of the throne to the left of the emperor himself remaining alone in the center of the hall during the transformation.

ALBANI'S TRIUMPHS.

Are Unique in the History of Canada.

Never has any singer enjoyed the success in Canada to be compared with that of Madame Albani. Those who remember the mammoth snow shoe parade which was organized in Montreal seventeen years ago when Albani appeared there for the first time. The Diva was met at the Station by ten thousand men and women on snow shoes, her horses taken from the traces, and the sleigh was drawn by as many men as could get hold of the long ropes that had been prepared for the purpose. A three days carnival was given at that time, and the Diva was feted and honored as prima donna has never been before or since probably. The people of Montreal were proud of their fellow townsman, as they claimed her as such, Chambly her birth place being but a mile or two distant, and they took every reasonable means at their disposal to express their approval. Now the great singer is saying good bye, and the feeling is just as cordial, as at that time, which accounts for the great success she is now meeting with on her eastern tour, which will be duplicated here.
