THE COAL STRIKE IS DECLARED OFF

Miners Accept First Proposition of Operators—On Advice of President Mitchell—Operators Want Compact For Three Years—A Conference in New York Today—No Discrimination to Be Made Against Miners Who Obeyed the Suspension Order.

SCRANTON, Pa., May 6 (Special)—The coal strike is off. On advice of President Mitchell on Saturday the Miner's Convention voted unanimously to accept the first proposition of the operators for a continuation of the award of the anthracite coal commission with a modification that the term for which it shall be continued shall be mutually agreed upon.

EQUALIZATION OF FREIGHT CHARGES

An Entirely New, Important and Beneficial Departure Regarding Live Stock at the Coming Exhibition—Rule Inserted in Prize List, And Prizes Practically Doubled.

The following rule is being inserted in the prize list for the Interprovincial Exhibition to be held in Charlottetown in October next:

EQUALIZATION OF FREIGHT. Freight charges on Live Stock having its starting point beyond 15 miles of Charlottetown entered for competition and coming to the Exhibition on the Prince Edward Island Railway or Island Steamers (except the Southport and Rocky Point ferries) will be borne by the Exhibition Association.

Freight charges on Live Stock entered for competition and coming to the Exhibition from the Mainland from Truro via Pictou and intermediate points and from Moncton via Point du Chene and intermediate points on the I. C. Railway, Charlottetown Steam Navigation Company's steamers and Prince Edwards Island Railway will also be borne by the Exhibition Association.

MUTUAL'S REPORT SAVES \$2,000,000

First Quarter's Statement Since Reorganization Shows a General Cut in Expenses . . Great Reduction in the Ratio of Cost to Renewal of Business and that Recently Acquired.

NEW YORK, May 4.—At the regular meeting of the board of trustees of the Mutual Life Insurance Company recently the report for the first quarter of the year 1906 was made public. As it is the first quarterly report made since the company's reorganization the figures afford interesting comparisons with those of the same period of last year.

While there has been a marked falling off of new business, the economies inaugurated by the present management are indicated by a reduction in the general expense account, which if maintained throughout the entire year, will aggregate a saving of about \$2,000,000. There is also a great reduction in the ratio of cost to the new and renewal business.

For the first three months of 1906 new premiums received by the Mutual aggregated only \$299,170.53 as against \$2,318,359.42 in the first quarter of 1905. Renewal premiums for the same period of this year were \$14,148,305.04, comparing with \$13,772,140.44 last year. Interest and rents received amounted to \$4,205,282.82 for the quarter ending March 31, 1906, and this year the same items amounted to \$4,578,917.88.

To policy holders the Mutual paid in the first quarter of 1906, \$9,008,430.50, as against \$8,587,607.24 in the same quarter of 1905. The commissions paid this year on new business were \$641,649.30. They were \$1,644,405.00 in the first three months of 1905, the great saving being due to the dropping off of new business indicated by the decrease of new premiums noted.

PARLIAMENT OF RUSSIA MEETING

Members Coming to St. Petersburg—The Hopes and Fears of the Parties.

ST. PETERSBURG, May 6—(Special)—Members of the National Parliament and Council are arriving by every train, with many distinguished visitors to witness the opening of the Russian Parliament on Thursday by the Czar, with great formality.

No trouble is anticipated. The new Cabinet has announced a policy of hands off, practically declaring that as long as the parliament does not meddle with the fundamental laws of the Empire it will be allowed to offer its own solutions for the nation's problems.

With this all except the extreme revolutionists are satisfied. The Constitutional democrats are confident that within a few months the Czar will be forced to grant a constitution.

BOMB THROWING RUSSIANS AGAIN

Governor General of Moscow Escapes But Thrower and Two Others Killed.

MOSCOW, May 5—(Special)—A bomb was thrown today at a carriage in which Vice Admiral Denikassoff, Governor General of Moscow, was driving.

He was wounded in the foot and his aide-de-camp and Secretary were killed. The man who threw the bomb also perished. He wore officer's uniform.
