PRESENTATION AND ADDRESS TO A PASTOR

Rev. W. H. and Mrs. Spencer Were Remembered.

BY THE CONGREGATION.

Of Brackley Point, Stanhope and Cove Head—Interesting Address. Reply: The Gifts.

Owing to the extremely bad roads, instead of a social meeting in the Covehead Church as had been intended, in response to an invitation given on Sabbath, a number of the members of the northern section of the Presbyterian congregation, of which the Rev. W. H. Spencer is pastor, gathered on Monday forenoon at the home of James H. Gregor, Brackley Point, to which the pastor and his partner were also invited. Most enjoyable hours were spent in a free and social way at the hospitality of the host and his genial family, during which was revealed the generous object in view, by the presentation to their pastor of a large and valuable sleigh robe, and to Mrs. Spencer of a Bokbarra fur jacket, accompanied with the following address, read by James G. McCallum. To the Rev. W. H. Spencer:

REV. AND DEAR SIR:—In behalf and in the name of your friends in Stanhope, Covehead, Brackley Point, and Brackley Point Road at this time of the year when good wishes are much in evidence, and as one year of your presence and labor with us as our pastor and teacher has passed away—we beg leave to tender you the compliments of the season and express to you our appreciation of your labors, which have been both arduous and self-depending to a large extent. In the pulpit your discourses have been of a high order, carefully throughout, instructive, uplifting, and edifying.

At the bedside of the sick, as also beside the bier of the departed you have been a ministering angel.

How appropriate and comforting have been your words and all with that energy and promptness which has invariably merited our approval. And here and now, dear sir, we ask of you and Mrs. Spencer (whom we know to be a worthy help-mate) to accept of these articles which will be comfortable to you both at this in-lament season of the year. Truly our hopes and aspirations for the future are that both pastor and people may so conduct themselves that we all may have the blessing of our Heavenly Father and that our union may be long, and that you may have many souls for a crown of rejoicing.

The occasion was further brightened by the cheering and impressive responses made by the recipient, expressing the gratification and encouragement afforded by such pleasing surprises, which, if judged by like experiences in the past, would not soon be forgotten. In addition to the value of the gifts, was even greater the pleasure and purpose of heart, in the givers, that prompted such tokens of sympathy and appreciation as were expressed in their gifts and address. While thanking them for their gifts and good wishes, Mr. Spencer noted the words in their address which had touched his ear most impressively, the words "in the pulpit," "at the bedside of the sick," and "beside the bier of the departed

which words suggest spheres of greatest pressure and responsibility. In what vocation of life, on what mortal man, rests greater responsibility than on him who stands in such places—in the pulpit proclaiming the gospel with the view of persuading souls to Christ—at the bedside of the sick and dying in fellowship with the individual on things immortal—and beside the bier in sympathetic touch with kindred living souls in sorrow and affliction—in the three between the departed and the living, between God and man, to man for God, and to God for man. None can form any conception of it, but those who in good and pure conscience and by experience have realized the pressure of responsibility and telling effects of even the word spoken. At times there comes the almost shrieking—yet with that pressure are associated inexpressible joys of soul arising in the services of the Master, who can measure the power of a word, who can know the joys of service. Another thing in the address impressed him—the pastor and the people and their respective parts—that each so conduct themselves as to obtain the blessings of Heaven. On the part of the pastor are duties, with cares, anxieties, seasons of trials and embarrassment, but amid all—while determined not to know anything among them save Christ, and Him crucified, and the uplifting of the Zion being erected on that foundation, the pastor may go faithfully on, saying as for the rest, "none of these things move me." Truly on the people's side there are important parts to perform, for while pastors and teachers may be as recruiting officers and general leaders of the people—it devolves upon the officers, rank and file, as the marshalled hosts to untidily stand true to the one Sovereign, true to the cause of that Sovereign, the development and extension of His kingdom in its temporal affairs, as also even more in the social, moral and spiritual life of the Church. Side by side with the duties and responsibilities of the one are those of the other.

For one year they had associated together, as for himself he had, thought the field was large and arduous, enjoyed that year finding homes and hearts open, and while they wished the union to be a long one, amid the uncertainties of life, it might, at God's pleasure, be and with them he joined, may there be many souls to God as a crown of rejoicing to all. Mrs. Spencer also spoke, expressing thanks for this gift, and for many other tokens of thoughtful kindness in smaller ways at her home, and that, kind as were the people of the former pastorate, which she once thought could not easily be equalled, she had found them not behind here.
