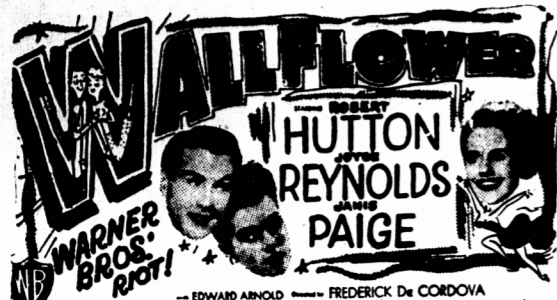

The Anniversary Of The Presbyterian Church

The Murray Harbour North Presbyterian congregation will celebrate the sixty-fifth anniversary of the erection of its present church on Sunday, September 5, 1948.

In 1883 the congregation was divided and two new churches were built, one at Murray Harbour North, one mile east of the old site, and the other at Peters Road, five miles west of it.

Murray Harbour North Church is a fine example of rural church architecture. A graceful spire, which can be seen for miles, adds dignity and impressiveness to the edifice.

Special services marking the sixty-fifth anniversary of the erection of the church will be held on Sunday, September 6th, 1948, at 11:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.
