is guilty of an offense and liable to a penalty of not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor less than ten dollars (\$10.00) who hunts or kills or attempts to hunt or kill any fox not in captivity, except between the first day of December and the thirty-first day of January.

"A fox in captivity, or escaped from captivity, is defined as a domestic animal." The Minister of Agriculture whose department is charged with the social security of the fox, lost some dozen chickens himself recently in a raid, and is incensed that the law protects such vandals. He believes there should "be a bounty on them."

Mr. Louis MacPhee, butcher, of Clyde River, reports a great deal of destruction in his district. Quite a number of lambs have been reported killed by foxes by Mr. Angus Cameron, Clyde River, Mr. Hughie MacPhee, Canoe Cove, and others.

Mr. Stewart Jones, president of Pheasants Unlimited, says that numerous reports reach him of game-birds killed by foxes and pointed out that the lack of control at the present time in the National Park fosters the increase of the fox and skunk menace on the Island. He stated that the Fish and Game Association has approached the Dominion Parks branch through Mr. J. A. Rodd, regarding the control of predators through special trapping licences.

In the meantime Reynard goes on his merry way with little fear that the two months' open season on him, starting next month, will cause him much trouble. He probably knows that the best red fox pelt will only bring \$4 anyway, and who would bother with that these times?

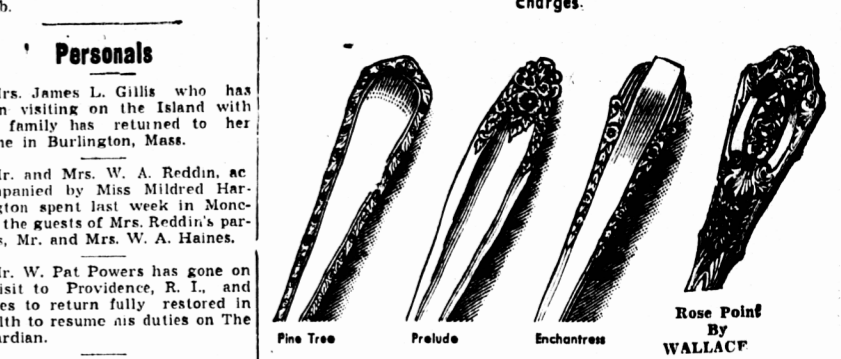
