THE COOK'S CORNER

PINEAPPLE FRUIT CUP

One cup chopped pineapple (canned or fresh), one cup diced banana, one cup strawberries cut in halves. Reserve a few of the finest berries to use as a garnish. Mix the fruits together, and if fresh pineapple is used sprinkle with a little powdered sugar and lemon juice. No sugar will be necessary with canned pineapple. Chill and serve in cocktail glasses.

SPRING COCKTAIL

Cook young rhubarb until soft. Strain, measure and add 1-3 the quantity of sugar, boiling, together for two minutes. To one-half cup of this rhubarb juice, add 1-4 cup of syrup from canned pineapples, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, 1-2 cup soda water, and mix all together in a cocktail shaker. Put crushed ice in 4 cocktail glasses, pour in the mixture and serve.

FISH PIE WITH POTATOES

One-half pound cooked fish, 1-2 cup white sauce, 1 hard-cooked egg lemon juice, pepper, salt, 1-2 pound mashed potatoes, 2 table spoons butter and a little beaten egg. Place the fish in a buttered baking dish, sprinkle with pepper, salt and a little lemon juice. Pour over this the white sauce. Add the butter and a little hot milk to mashed potatoes, and beat until very light with cream. Lightly fry on top of fish and brown in a hot oven. Serve hot.

JELLED APRICOTS

Boll together 3-4 cup boiling water and one-quarter cup sugar for 1 minute. Add 1 cup of apricot syrup, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, a few grains of salt and 1-2 tablespoons granulated gelatine soaked in 1-4 cup cold water. Cook 1-3 cup seedless raisins in 1-4 cup boiling water until they are plump. Add to the jelly mixture with 2-3 cup canned apricots cut in small pieces. Turn into mould, chill, and serve with or without whipped cream.

To prevent feathers working their way through a pillow, turn the ticking to the wrong side and lay it on a table.

Then rub the ticking thoroughly with a slightly warmed piece of beeswax so that the entire surface is covered, and it will be impossible for any feathers to come out.

Give your indoor plants a drop of olive oil once a week; you will find they grow much more quickly, and will be a nice glossy green.

If windows are very dirty, wipe them first with a damp cloth. Then wipe again with a cloth dipped in methylated spirits. No polishing is required.

A little oil of cloves added to the paste used for paperhanging will keep it sweet.

Two tablespoons of methylated spirits to the last rinsing water will stiffen and gloss linen without starch. A tablespoon of borax dissolved in a bowl of hot water is excellent for stiffening voile, muslin and organdie collars.

Mark your household linen with the date and year it is bought, as well as with your name, so that its length of service can be easily checked at a glance.

When painting, rub hands and arms with vaseline. Paint will not crack.
