

IN MEMORIAM
 MRS. BERTHA STANLEY SEALEY
 MARLBORO. — Mrs. Bertha (Stanley) Sealey, age 56, wife of William H. Sealey, 67 West Main street, died suddenly following a heart attack at 10.30 last night while a guest at a shower party at the home of a neighbor. Her sudden passing comes as a distinct shock to her many friends in this city and in Southboro, where she

resided for many years before establishing her home in Marlboro. Apparently in usual health, although she had been afflicted with a heart ailment for several years, Mrs. Sealey was among those making merry at the shower at which she was one of a large number of guests. She was stricken suddenly and was dead in a few moments after her arrival at her home. All efforts of Dr. C. W. Smith to restore her to consciousness were unavailing.
