## Cardinals Climb closer

NEW YORK, May 12—(AP)—Veteran Lonnie Warneke threw a seven-hit ball game and St. Louis Cardinals defeated Pirates 6-2 at Pittsburgh to sweep the two-game National League series.

Only Vince Dimaggio gave Leonie trouble as the crafty right-hander sailed smoothly to his fourth triumph of the season. Vince robbed Warneke of a shutout by blasting a home run in the fifth inning.

The victory inched the second place Cards a half game closer to the league-leading Brooklyn Dodgers who were idle today. A game and a half now separates the contenders.

At Cincinnati behind Bill Lee's six-hit hurling, Chicago Cubs did not play today, clawing out a 12-1 victory over the Reds in the fiercest exhibition of sandlot baseball the league season has produced.

Stan Hack, first up in the first inning, walked; Lou Stringer tripped him home and the b.b. parade was on to continue three innings.

In all, three Red hurlers allowed 14 hits, served up 10 bases on balls, and one, Jim Turner, contributed one of his team's four errors. Lee walked five, struck out two.

## Blind golfer Plays 'by ear'

TORONTO, May 12—(CP)—Totally blinded at the Battle of the Somme in the First Great War and "bombed out of England" a year ago, William H. J. Oxenham, playing golf "by ear" has started his season on the golf links here. Oxenham co-operates with the National Institute for the Blind and helped the organization open its appeal for funds this year.

Toronto golfers concede that although his physical handicap is high, his golf handicap is low. He shoots generally in the low 90s. He has his own special caddy, trained to face the club behind the ball on long shots. After that he's on his own, and can whip out drives that average 175 yards.

Oxenham is good with long irons, too, and when he gets within pitching distance of the green, his caddy walks over to the hole and guides him by voice. That's why he's one of the few golfers who can play by ear. He can pitch one towards the hole with great precision.

In England last year a string of bombs fell 40 yards from the Oxenham home and the family decided to build a dug-out. They slept in the dug-out for several nights and all was quiet, so they returned to the house and the first night they were back the Nazis came over in the worst raid in weeks. That was when Mr. Oxenham decided to come to Canada.

## Royals 1-2 game Out of top

MONTREAL, May 12—(CP)—Coasting home behind the six-hit pitching of Ed Head, who marked up his third successive triumph, Montreal Royals scored a 4-0 win over Baltimore Orioles here today and moved within half a game of the idle Newark Bears, International League leaders.

Head, back in action after being laid up almost two weeks with tonsillitis, fanned six and walked three as he registered his first shut-out of the season.

## Sox tighten Grip on second

NEW YORK, May 12—(AP)—Red Sox took a tighter hold on second place in the American League by conquering New York Yankees 8-4 at Boston today, to give old Lefty Bob Grove the 295th victory of his major league career.

It was the fourth straight triumph for the Red Sox and moved them to 1-2 games behind the idle Cleveland Indians.

At Washington, the Senators bunched eight hits effectively behind the six-hit hurling of Dutch Leonard to defeat Philadelphia 5-1. It was the veteran knuckle baller's third straight victory of the season.

## Javelin or ball It's wrist twist

LINCOLN, Neb., May 12—(CP)—Did you know a baseball pitcher and a javelin thrower have a lot in common?

Here's what Herb Grote, University of Nebraska junior and Big Six javelin champion, has to say about it.

Both need a good warmup before going into action and both depend a lot on wrist motion.

Grote takes a real long warmup, a couple of hours if he can work it in.

"Wrist action, that's what counts. The proper flick and snap of the wrist at the right time—that's what makes a good curve ball. I try to get that same whip of the wrist in my throws with the javelin.

"When I fire the spear, I am not throwing for any object. I have shed it at a distance. I think I should reach. Instead, I hang up an imaginary object somewhere in the sky and aim for it."

## BARGAIN EXCURSIONS TO WESTERN CANADA

Special bargain excursions to Western Canada are being announced by passenger traffic officers of the Canadian National and Canadian Pacific railways. Tickets will be on sale May 17 to May 28 inclusive and provide for a return limit of 45 days to allow of an extensive stay at the western destination.

During the same period, similar privileges will be available to residents in Western Canada, providing for a flow of traffic in each direction. From points in Eastern Canada the intending traveller may select any destination in the prairies or British Columbia, but it is probable that the greater portion of the traffic will be for Winnipeg, Regina, Saskatoon, Calgary, Edmonton, Banff, Jasper, Prince Rupert, Vancouver and Victoria.
