 CHICAGO, July 15 (AP) — The fight fan's dream — the second installment of the middleweight championship rivalry between Rocky Zale and Rocky Graziano — comes off in Chicago Stadium tomorrow night, and it should be a humdinger.

The last match, at Yankee Stadium in September, champion Tony came back from the verge of dreamland to save his title in a game performance.

It was a pre-six punch-party all the way between Zale, the Indiana steel millhand, who specializes in thumping body punches, and the Rocky-style beller from New York's lower east side streets, who wears an ether can for a right hand.

The result is, the bash boulevardiers are gathering from near and far for this one to give it all the earmarks of a heavyweight title "super-colossal." Some 250 sports writers are here to cover it. And the customers already have contributed enough cash — at \$30 a ringside pew — to assure an all-time high gate for an indoor fight. The bill for tomorrow's night, with a \$425,000 house expected.
