THE VALUE OF FRESH AIR.

The girl who wants to look bright and fresh, with clear skin and a sparkling eye, simply must learn that the first rule for acquiring this freshness and sparkle or for retaining it is to sleep in a room which is plentifully supplied with fresh air. If she is too tired to go to the trouble of opening the window, or if she forgets, she must expect a heavy head, a dull eye and a lifeless complexion the next morning.

Sleep is nature's method of restoring the used-up energy of the day. During the hours of slumber she sets to work all her carpenters and mechanics rebuilding the worn tissues of the body, getting them in smooth running order so that she may send a practically new person out into the world at the beginning of another day.

One of the storage batteries from which nature draws her supplies is the air. If this supply is fresh and pure, the result will be a finished, perfected piece of work. But if an inferior supply of air is furnished for the repairing, the result is bound to be anything but satisfactory. Nature cannot make a perfect man from imperfect material, any more than man can make a brand new garment out of a worn piece of cloth.

Fresh air in the room does not mean that the sleeper must have a gale blowing down upon him or that he must sleep in a current of air. Draughts should be avoided and damp air should be admitted to the room sparingly. Be careful to have the sleeping room open as much as possible to the air and sunshine during the day. At night lower the windows from the top and raise the blinds so that the air has free passage.

This fresh air invigorator will be found a certain remedy for that dazed feeling that accompanies early rising and will loose bonds of lethargy that hold one in bed long past the hour appointed for getting up. It will mean less lateness to work, more outdoor activity and more of the spirit of fun and frolic socially. Best of all, it will subvert years from both the appearance and the feeling of men and women.

CHICAGO, June 26—June is setting a new record for marriages in Cook county. But it is travelling much faster toward a new record for divorces. In the first seventeen days of the

month Chicago was thirty marriage license ahead of the first seventeen days of the same month in 1910. But it was also thirty-seven divorces ahead of the same period. The increase in marriages is slightly over 1 per cent., while the increase in divorces is a little more than 22 per cent.
