Contract Bridge

OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

The declarer in today's deal ran up against a horrible trump break, but his sound technique overcame that obstacle.

North dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

♠ A K 6
♥ Q 4
♦ A 8 7
♣ A 9 4 3 2

♠ 9 8 6 2
♥ 10 5 4 3
♦ 2
♣ Q 10 6 5

The bidding:
North East South West
1♠ Pass 1♥ Pass
2♠ Pass 3♥ Pass
4♠ Pass 6♣ Pass

West, looking only for a lead that was not apt to cost a trick, opened the club eight. Declarer captured East's queen and led the spade deuce to the king, getting somewhat of a shock when East showed out. Obviously there was great danger of losing two trump tricks, and whereas South had been sorry at first sight of dummy, that he had not reached a grand-slam contract, it now was obvious that even the small slam was in jeopardy.

South cashed the queen, king and ace of hearts and then the diamond king. Next he led the diamond jack to the ace and ruffed dummy's last diamond. When this trick was not over-ruffed by West, success was in sight. Declarer now laid down the heart jack. West discarded his last club (it would have done him no good to ruff) and declarer, now with a perfect count on West's original distribution, led a spade to the ace and returned the club ace. West had to ruff this trick, and then had to lead a spade from his remaining J-9 to declarer's Q-10.

vanilla and strong black coffee to taste. Turn into a freezer and freeze until mushy, then add 1 cup marrons that have been cut into pieces and soaked in a thick sugar syrup over night. Continue to freeze until done. Pack in ice and salt for 3 hours before using. A strictly "company" dessert.
