A "RECORD" IN "HUSTLE."

The following, from the Daily Mail overseas edition, will be of interest in this Province. The Mauretania arrived at Fishguard on Thursday night, thus triumphantly achieving the task imposed upon her—that of performing the double journey from England to New York and back within 12 days, including the necessary complete "turn round" of the great Currunder at the American port. This is an achievement that may well excite enthusiasm on both sides of the Atlantic.

The annual meeting of the New Glasgow Dairying Co., was held in New Glasgow Hall, Jan. 25th. James Arthur, Pres., occupied the chair. A large number of shareholders and patrons were present and expressed their satisfaction in the progress that is being made in dairying. The gross value of butter and cheese during the year was \$26,000, average price of butter 25cts, average price of cheese during the year \$26,000, average price of butter 96cts per 100 lbs, for cheese 4cts. per 100 lbs. The board of directors elected by ballot are—James Arthur, Pres.; Joseph E. Bagnall Vice Pres.; Abraham Buote, Sec'y; Walter Buntain, Donald Andrews, Albert Parkman, Oliver Le Page. Some of the largest patrons received for milk, as follows—Robert Bagnall \$559, Joseph Bagnall, \$408, Oliver LePage, \$364, James Arthur, \$342, Walter Buntain \$340, Donald Andrews \$326, R. W. Stevenson \$306, Edison Rollings \$305.

The will of the late Benjamin Rogers, City, was presented for probate yesterday morning. The will was dated January 7th, 1905. The Executors of the will are Benjamin Rogers, F. L. Hazard and Mrs. C. M. Rogers. F. L. Hazard is the solicitor and the trustees are G. J. Rogers, Benj. Rogers and F. L. Hazard. The estate is valued at \$183,550.72 made up as follows:—real estate \$25,300, stocks, \$152,160, mortgages, \$4,574.72 and furniture \$1,516. The stock included 200 shares in the Bank of Nova Scotia, valued at \$55,000, 57 shares in the Steam Navigation Company worth \$21,600, 400 shares in the telephone company \$10,150. The property is left as follows:—The Fairhill residence, furniture and all effects to his widow absolutely, also \$3,000 a year, the estate to pay taxes, insurance and necessary repairs to the property, \$1,000 a year, and the residue to be divided equally among his children, namely:—Henry Williams, \$500. To his servant girl, Jessie McLeod, \$500. To the P. E. Island Hospital \$500. After the death of his wife and daughter (the latter dying without issue) all the estate then remaining shall go to his children then living, and the children of any deceased child or children of a deceased child taking the share to which the parent would have been entitled if living. He directed that any outstanding on the mortgage of M. Pidgeon be paid and the mortgage satisfied. The surplus each year, after paying annuities is to be divided equally among his children. The succession duty payable to the Provincial Government on this large estate at 2 1/2 per cent will amount to no inconsiderable sum.
