SUNDAY SCHOOL ASSOCIATION.—A very successful rally of the York district S. S. Association, was held in the Harrington Presbyterian church on Tuesday evening the 10th inst. Interesting items of the program were the musical selections furnished by the S. S. children from Harrington and St. Ann's, also the violin selections given by Rev. Mr. Littlejohns. The speakers of the evening were the Rev. Mr. Westmorland of York, Rev. Mr. Fash of Charlottetown, and Mr. C. J. Reilly, Secretary of the Y.M.C.A. Mr. Westmorland was the first speaker. His subject was "The Child". Childhood is the period of growth and development, the path before the child is new and all untravelled and full of delightful mysteries. Its imagination is peopled with visions which to it are as real as are every day matters of fact matters, with us children of an older growth. How needful it is to direct the young and tender mind along the path of virtue and of truth. The parent and the teacher have, before them the problem, and the privilege of setting before the children placed under their care, the highest ideals and the brightest examples. That from earliest youth they may be led Godward and Heavenward. Mr. Reilly spoke on the subject of "The Boy in the S. S.". "Too often we leave our work of rescue, until the victim has fallen, said the speaker. It is better always, to put a strong fence at the top of the cliff than an ambulance down in the valley. We find that the S. S. records all over the country show that between the ages of 15 and as the boys drop out of the school. There must be a reason for this. The little children love to go to S. S. and as they go they are taught the beautiful lessons from the Bible. It is not just as necessary for the parent to know and understand, as much as possible of God's word. Parents take your children to S. S. go with them that they may get converted, and that you with them may learn of God.


