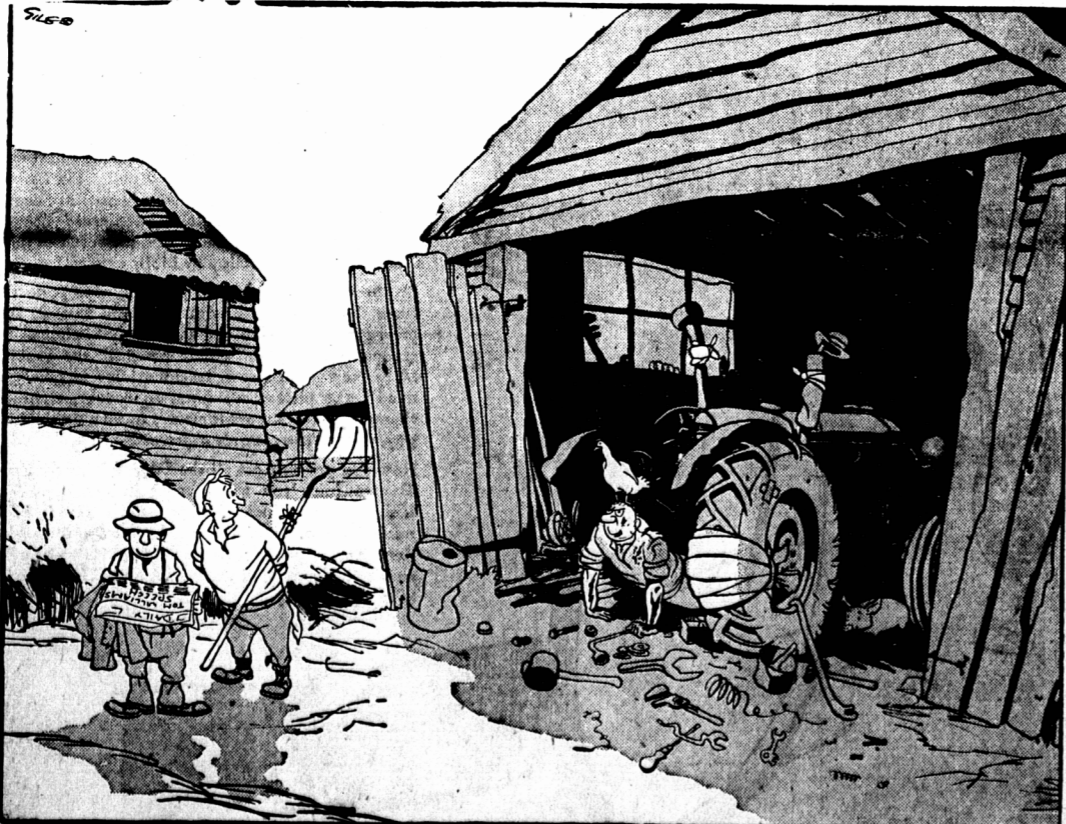

Liberal Address By The Hon. T. W. L. Prowse

by sending the two Liberal candidates to represent you in the new Liberal Government which will be formed after December 11th.

Let me now take a few minutes to tell you the contributions that the Jones Government made to Charlottetown in the past four years.

In addition to the above is an approximate amount of \$11,000.00 which will be spent by the Liberal Government to keep the streets of Charlottetown clear of snow in the winter.

You will also notice in the above statement that Charlottetown will receive \$8,000.00 more in a grant in lieu of Corporation Taxes, also a special grant of \$1.00 per capita which amounts to \$14,821.00 in lieu of Railway taxable property in Charlottetown in the above magnificent grants to Charlottetown. It is easily seen that if it were not for that, every holder of real estate and personal property would have to pay at least one-quarter to one-half per cent more than your present tax rate. That is what the Jones Government has done for Charlottetown headed by a former Premier, Honourable J. Walter Jones.

And that is not all—the Airport Housing that was conducted by the City of Charlottetown, along with the Local and Federal Government's assistance, was thrown on the hands of the Local Government, because the City found it too expensive to operate. The Local Government is now operating this emergency housing, thus relieving the housing shortage to a great extent, as quartered in this shelter are 104 families. The majority of these people work in our City and are citizens of Charlottetown and spend their money in the City.

You will also notice that the disastrous dump by the Hillsboro Bridge has been filled in and almost completely as a dump thus relieving Charlottetown of an eyesore. The expense of this work was paid by the Provincial Government.

Other Improvements

Another situation close to Charlottetown, on the St. Peter's Road, was the swamp at Parkdale. This swamp has now been drained, practically made dry, thus doing away with another nuisance to the people of Charlottetown Common and Royalty.

Another asset has been added to Charlottetown, that is the Memorial Field at Victoria Park, through the efforts of the Physical Fitness Department of the Government headed by Lt. Col. W. W. Reid. An estimate of the value of the work done is about \$6,368.00, and it is a mighty fine gift of the Physical Fitness Department of the Jones Government to the City of Charlottetown.

Other things contemplated by the Jones Government after December 11th will be seen in our local papers, as the election date draws near.

All these additional grants to Charlottetown could not have been made possible except for the acceptance of the new Financial Agreement at Ottawa by the Jones Government. This was opposed by all Conservatives headed by the Leader of the Opposition, Honourable Dr. W. J. P. MacMillan. Therefore, what can Charlottetown expect from the Conservative Government (should they get the Government) because without this agreement Charlottetown would suffer a financial hardship which could only be met by additional taxes on our citizens by the City Council. Our citizens now are sufficiently taxed under present circumstances.

Under this magnificent financial agreement with the Dominion, Prince Edward Island will this year receive over \$2,285,000.00 as compared with \$657,000.00 obtained from Ottawa by all previous Governments. The credit of this Province is higher than that of any other Province in Canada, and we can obtain more favourable rates on our bonds than any other Province.

Despite the large expenditures made in the Province for Public Health and other necessary services, we are today paying less interest on borrowed money than we were six years ago. So what is the use of Dr. MacMillan telling you, as he did two months ago, that we are facing provincial bankruptcy? We were never in our history in a sounder financial position, and the figures will back me up in that statement. Only six months ago the Government was able to finance a \$1,000,000 bond issue at 2 1/2% which sold for a fraction of a cent under par. Does this look like provincial bankruptcy?

Public Health

I have referred to the large expenditure on Public Health in this Province. The MacMillan Government spent a little over \$300,000 a year on Public Health; this year the Jones Government Budget calls for the enormous sum of \$1,100,000 on Public Health and Welfare—nearly four times as much. Included in this is the new grant to hospitals which is paid on the basis of 50 cents per day per bed in each and every hospital. The grants formerly paid to hospitals by MacMillan Government have thus been increased threefold.

Such an excellent financial arrangement as has been completed with Ottawa, which is readily secured because the two Governments were in line. The file of the present Liberal administration at Ottawa extends to 1930, so that for the next three years at least, we may expect a Liberal Government in power in Canada. And with the assistance we have from Ottawa we may easily expect the Liberals to be in power there indefinitely.

For instance, in this Province alone we receive over \$2,000,000 annually from Children's Allowances, and nearly a million more from the Old Age and Blind Pensions. This makes a grand total of nearly \$6,000,000 a year that comes to this Province from Ottawa, is there any likelihood that the Ottawa Government will change? And if we have a Liberal Government in Ottawa we should live in a Liberal government in Prince Edward Island—as with the two Governments in line we can expect a further expansion of the already magnificent services provided for us along the line.

The press published Wednesday morning the manifesto of the Liberal Party which was announced on Tuesday night by Premier Jones. I would strongly urge every elector of Prince Edward Island to read the list of accomplishments of the Jones Government over carefully, also the good things to come under the new Jones Government of which I hope to become a member again after December 11th.

The time at our disposal will not allow Dr. Dougan and myself to call on every one personally; therefore, we would appreciate it

if you would overlook our not calling on you and please give us your support.

Dr. Dougan or myself will be heard again before the election to tell you of the many things we hope to procure and do for the people of the 15th District of Queen's in the next four years.

In closing let me again thank you all in the City of Charlottetown, Common, and Royalty for your kindness to me at all times.
