Public notice is hereby given that, to satisfy the requirement that British subjects entering the United Kingdom should hold a passport or equivalent document, the Imperial Authorities have consented to accept a certificate, signed by a Canadian Immigration Agent, establishing the nationality of the holder, and identifying him by means of his signature and photograph placed thereon.
Such certificates may be obtained from Immigration Agents at the following points:—
Halifax, St. John, Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, Hamilton, London, Port William, Port Arthur, Winnipeg, Moose Jaw, Saskatoon, Prince Albert, Lloydminster, Edmonton, Calgary, Vancouver and Victoria.
These certificates, however, will be available only for the purpose of entering Great Britain, and their holders will find it necessary to obtain Foreign Office passports before leaving the United Kingdom.
