The Lord's Day Alliance--Sixth Ann. Meeting

Report Of The Secretary For The Year. Many Matters Discussed- Resolution Passed The Officers Elected For The Ensuing Years

The annual meeting of the P. E. I. Lord's Day Alliance was held in Summerside on Wednesday November 20. Representatives from various parts of the Island were present and the L. D. A. of Canada was represented by its two secretaries, Rev. T. Albert Moore, and Rev. W. G. Hanna. Following is the report of the Secretary, which covers the work of the year:

"To-day we assemble in the Sixth Annual Meeting of the P. E. I. Lord's Day Alliance. The year which we have under review has been marked by various events of outstanding importance to the work.

"First, we note several changes in the personnel of our workers. The hand of death has taken from us the greatly beloved and highly esteemed President of the Lord's Day Alliance of Canada, The Rev. John Potts, D. D., LL. D., was not a Canadian by birth, but he loved the land of his adoption, and unsparringly gave of his great gifts for the true advancement of every moral cause that would help to build up this land in righteousness. We express our unqualified appreciation of the splendid service he rendered the Alliance.

"We also miss the presence and counsel of the Rev. J. G. Shearer, D. D., the alert, active, and indefatigable Secretary who organized the Alliance in this Province, and has ever given us valuable help in our work. He was called by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada to take charge of a newly organized department of Moral and Social Reform, and felt that he could not decline the position. Mr. Shearer still retains his interest in the work of the Alliance, and will ever be ready to assist us with his counsel.

"Rev. T. Albert Moore has taken up the position tendered vacant by Dr. Shearer's retirement. This left the office of Associate Secretary for Eastern Canada vacant and we have pleasure in welcoming to this office Rev. W. G. Hanna, B. A. We assure him of our well wishes for his success. In our future work we shall see much of each other, and are persuaded that the pleasant relations that held with his predecessors will be continued in his case. We trust that Mr. Hanna will have the opportunity of visiting our P. E. I. Branches within the year, and become acquainted with the situation and workers in our Province.

"This year is also outstanding in that it is marked by the coming into force of the Lord's Day Act. Already the Act has resulted in giving liberty to many thousands of people, who heretofore had been compelled to work on the Lord's Day as on other days."

Rev. Mr. Strathie's report expressed gratification at the manner in which the Lord's Day is honored in this Province, and pointed out the necessity of seeing that the Lord's Day Act is properly observed, and that the Alliance be ever active and vigilant. His report concluded with an expression of confident hope for the future.

The Treasurer's Report showed that total receipts at closing of accounts, came to \$218.96, with a balance due the Treasurer of \$10.31. The accounts were audited by W. T. Huggan and declared correctly kept.

The attention of the alliance was drawn to the fact that Nov. 10th, a Sunday train left O'Leary in the morning for Charlottetown to attend a funeral, returning in the evening and that the train was in fact an excursion train, with many of the worst features of a Sunday excursion. A very strong resolution was adopted, a copy to be sent to the Supt. of the P. E. I. Railway, and to be published in the newspapers.

With reference to Sunday funerals the following resolution was carried:

"The Lord's Day Alliance suggests that wherever possible Sunday funerals be avoided, and further to meet the difficulty, that no arrangements for a funeral be completed without the minister who is to officiate being first consulted."

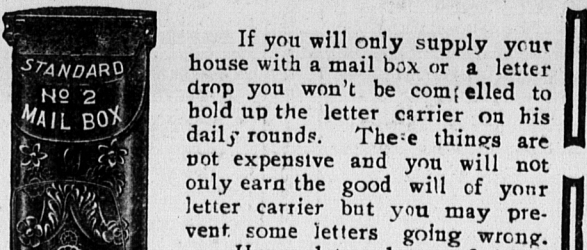
