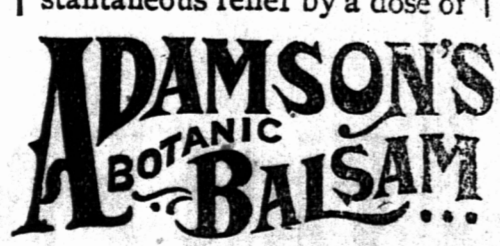

LOCAL LEGISLATURE.

THURSDAY, May 17.

After recess yesterday, the House met and waited upon His Honor the Lieut. Governor, and presented him with the answer to the Draft Address to the Speech from the Throne. On returning to the House, exception was taken by the Opposition through Messrs. Campbell, Gordon, Shaw and J. A. McDonald, that His Honor had vouchsafed no reply in writing to the answer to the Draft Address. This the Opposition contended was unconstitutional. Premier Farquharson, Mr. Peters, Hon. J. R. McLean and Hon. P. Sinclair stated that His Honor's answer was simply a matter of formality, and it made no difference whether the Governor's acceptance was given either in writing, verbally, or by bowing an assent. His Honor's assent on this occasion was given in the presence of all the members of the Legislature present, and it did not necessitate the Speaker giving any assurance of such assent when the members returned the Legislative Assembly. Many of the old formalities of Parliament had now become obsolete. New precedents are being established in many parliaments the object evidently being to abbreviate the proceedings as much as possible. This is quite reasonable in this practical age. The Opposition this session appear to be great sticklers for parliamentary usages when they themselves every day infringe upon the rules to the decorum so essentially necessary to the dignity of any Legislative body.

The reports on public accounts, Public Works and Crown Lands, were submitted by Premier Farquharson, Hon. J. R. McLean, Hon. A. McMillan respectively. House adjourned till 10 a. m. tomorrow.

FRIDAY, May 18.

House met at 12.10

Hon. James R. McLean submitted the supervisors' returns.

Mr. J. A. McDonald asked when the education report would be submitted.

Mr. Farquharson said it would likely be brought down during the day.

Mr. Campbell asked the Commissioner of Public Works to lay on the table of this House a statement in detail, showing how the sum of twenty-nine dollars and fifty cents was expended on Montgomery's bridge in 1898, the nature of the work done, the name of the parties who performed the work, and the amount paid to each person.

Hon. Jas. R. McLean laid the statement on the table of the House.

Mr. Campbell asked the Commissioner of Public Works to lay on the table of this House a statement of all amounts expended on Roads and Bridges by Supervisors in Road Districts Nos. 1, 2 and 5, in Queen's county, without sale or tender, the nature of the work done, the name of the road or bridge on which such work was performed, the names of the parties who performed the work, and the amount paid to each person.

Hon. Jas. R. McLean said information would be found in the Supervisors' returns.

Mr. Kieckham gave notice that he would tomorrow ask the Commissioner of Public Works if the government had received a petition from the inhabitants of Souris River and Rollo Bay, praying that a road be opened from McGoun's Road to head of Souris Road, leading through John Scullless line.

Hon. Mr. McLean said the petition had been received and would receive the consideration of the government.

Hon. Mr. Gordon asked for the report of the Asylum Commission.

Hon. Mr. Farquharson stated that the stenographer had not sufficient time to extend his notes in order that the Commission might have their report ready for the Legislature. The commissioners, however, had themselves gone over the shorthand notes with Mr. Croskill and were now preparing their report which they hoped to have ready in a short time when it would be given to the members.

Hon. J. W. Richards presented the School Report.

On motion of Mr. A. A. McLean the House went into committee on the bill to incorporate the Central Christian Church of this city. Reported agreed to and set down for third reading tomorrow.

Hon. Mr. Farquharson moved that supply be granted to Her Majesty. Carried.

Hon. Mr. Farquharson presented a bill to incorporate Fishermen's Bait Associations. Read a first time and ordered for second reading tomorrow.

Hon. Mr. Farquharson submitted a bill to incorporate the Cornwall Creamery Co. Read a first time and referred to Private Bills Committee. House then adjourned till 3 p. m. Monday.
