## CHARLOTTETOWN AND ELSEWHERE

George Finlayson, Ottawa, is visiting his home in Charlottetown.

Rev. John Hawley, Marshfield, will reach in Cavendish Church on Sunday afternoon next at 3 o'clock.

Col. H. M. Davison, Charlottetown, was a passenger east yesterday afternoon.

Among the passengers east from Charlottetown yesterday afternoon was Ray Rogers.

Miss Jennie Dollar of Brookfield has returned from Somerville, Mass., to spend the summer months at her home.

The term of Rev. Dr. Flanders in Centenary pulpit is to expire this year but it is just possible that the conference may grant an extension in his case so that he will be allowed to remain another year, in accordance with the request of the congregation. While he has accepted the pastorate of the First Methodist Church in London, Ontario, he is not to leave until June, 1913, which leaves a year at his disposal. It is customary for Methodist pastors to remain only four years in the one church but an extension on his terms has been granted.—St. John Exe. (Dr. Flanders is well known in Charlottetown.)

For the pulpit left vacant in Portland Church, St. John, by the removal of Rev. H. D. Marr, to the west, it is expected that the next pastor will be Rev. Henry Pierce of Florenceville, N.B., a native of this Province, who has been invited by the board. His name will come before the conference next week. Rev. Mr. Cole, late of the Primitive Methodist Church in England, has been acting as assistant pastor in Carmarthen Street Methodist Church, and it is probable that the matter of his being fully received into this district will be acted upon at the convention.

A number of officers and members of Alpha Rebekah Lodge No. 10 I. O. O. F., Charlottetown, accompanied by the degree staff, will leave this afternoon at five o'clock for Summerside where they will be present at the reinstatement to Good Fellowship of Maple Leaf Lodge No. 13 of that town. A number of other Odd Fellows officials will also accompany the Rebekahs, including J. J. McKinnon, Grand Secretary, and John F. Whelan, Past Grand Master. Miss Mary Esch, President of the Maritime Provinces, and Mrs. Henry Laphorne, District Deputy, will also accompany the party and assist in the ceremonies and ritualistic work. A special train will convey the Rebekahs and their friends, leaving at the above stated hour and returning during the early hours of the morning.

An official agricultural report says that the farmers of Prince Edward Island are still hoping that some better means will be provided for getting their products to a larger market. Farming conditions this spring are satisfactory and a successful season is anticipated. Referring to Prince Edward Island seeds, George H. Clark, Seed Commissioner at Ottawa, says: "The seed grain and the seed exhibition of Prince Edward Island are not surpassed in Canada, and the Island should and can hold the seed grain trade of the Maritime Provinces." In order to further encourage the farmers to raise better seed and more of it, a large number of prizes is offered this year in the fields of standing grain competition. Sixty prizes are offered for oats, thirty for wheat, twenty for barley.

Rev. A. F. Newcomb, district secretary of the Canadian Bible Society for the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland will leave St. John today for a two months visit to the Island Colony. He will address meetings in Amherst tomorrow and will sail the first of the week from North Sydney for Newfoundland. This will be his first visit to Newfoundland since assuming charge of the district in succession to Rev. G. M. Campbell, D. D., last fall and he will spend a couple of months there completing the organization of the society and visiting the branches, making his headquarters in St. John's. The Anglican Synod and the Methodist conference of Newfoundland will both meet this month and Mr. Newcomb will present the claims of the society at their sessions.—St. John Exe. (Revs. Newcomb and Campbell are well known in this Province.)

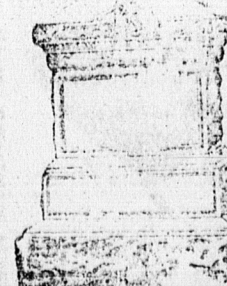
