WEDNESDAY.

WEDDING BELLS.—A quiet but very pretty wedding took place yesterday afternoon at 127 Hillsborough Street, Charlottetown, when two popular young people of Montague were joined together in the bonds of Holy Matrimony. The contracting parties were Miss Mamie J. Shaw and Vernon R. Ross. The ceremony was performed by Rev. W. D. Wilson, Ph. B. of Charlottetown. The happy couple left on the afternoon train for their future home in Montague.

WEDDING BELLS.—A pretty wedding took place at Notre Dame Convent at 6.15 o'clock yesterday morning when Mr. James J. Trainor, train despatcher of the P. E. I. Railway, Charlottetown, was united in marriage to Miss Florence McDonald of Grand Tracadie. The groom was supported by Mr. Jas. P. Hogan, while Miss Agatha McAulay assisted the bride. Rev. Dr. McLellan performed the ceremony after which the happy couple left on a wedding trip to Boston, New York, Niagara and other points of interest, special coach No. 10, the Superintendent's car being placed at their service.

FUNERAL FRIDAY.—The funeral of the late Rev. S. D. McPhee took place last Friday from the residence of his brother in law, Mr. James A. Nicholson, Orwell Cove. The services at the house were conducted by Rev. D. B. MacLeod assisted by Rev. J. W. MacKenzie. The remains were taken to St. John's Church, Belfast, where the main service was held, when Rev. Mr. MacKenzie, the pastor presided. Rev. Mr. MacLeod paid an eloquent tribute to the memory of the deceased, as a man, a friend, a christian and a minister. Short address dresses emphasizing the work and worth of the deceased were given by Rev. Mr. MacKenzie and Rev. Mr. MacNeill. The services were closed with the benediction by Rev. John Gillis of Wood Islands. A large congregation, filling the auditorium of the church, viewed for the last time all that was mortal of a former beloved pastor and friend after which the remains were consigned to their last resting place, in the beautiful Belfast cemetery.

INTERESTING APPEAL.—One of the matters to come before the Supreme Court of Canada at Ottawa this week is an interesting and important appeal from the Supreme Court of this province, Daniel R. Morrison v. The Summerside Water and Sewerage Commissioners. This litigation has been drawn out over some years. It started with a bill in Chancery by Mr. Morrison, against the Commissioners in which he claimed certain money to be owing to him under his contract with the commissioners for the installation of the water and sewerage system of Summerside. The case was heard before the Vice Chancellor and was dismissed. The complainant took the case to the Court of Appeal and Equity, which dismissed the appeal, confirming the decision of the Vice Chancellor. Mr. Morrison has carried his appeal now, to the Supreme Court of Canada. The appellant is represented by Mr. A. C. Saunders, and the respondents by Mr. Neil McQuarrie, K. C.

PRETTY WEDDING.—A very pretty wedding took place at St. Patrick's Church, Port Augustus, yesterday morning, when Miss Kathleen Cumiskey, daughter of Mr. J. H. Cumiskey and formerly teacher in the Model School, Prince of Wales College, became the wife of Mr. H. A. MacKenzie, of the P. E. I. Mail service. The ceremony was performed by Rev. A. J. McDonald, Parish Priest. The bride, who was given away by her father, was beautifully attired in white ivory satin with over-lace and pearl trimmings and carried a bouquet of carnations and maiden hair fern. The bridesmaid, Miss Stella Cumiskey, sister of the bride wore a very becoming gown of blue shadow velvet with black picture hat and carried a bouquet similar to that of the bride. The groom, Mr. Ray MacKenzie. After the ceremony the bridal party drove to the home of the bride's father at Webster's Corner where dinner was served, at which only the immediate relatives of the bride and groom were present. 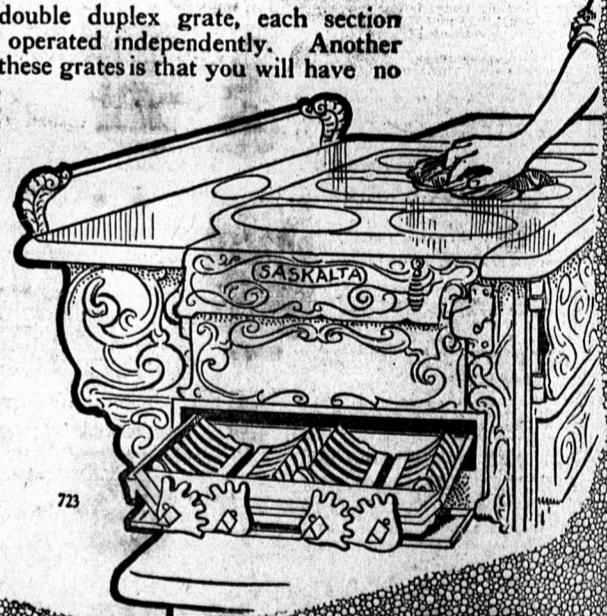
