



The British Soldier

The British soldier, 2 1/2 ft. is a remarkably handsome horse, dark chestnut, not white except star. A stout strong, compactly built horse, with heavy bone; stands square on the feet and legs.

He has proved himself to be the fastest trotting horse that ever raced in the Provinces. He holds the 4-year-old record made at Halifax, 1915, since the Charlottetown Track record since 1916, and he is the most likely horse in sight to reduce it in 1918.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over sixteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not at Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Buses—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section in good standing after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. V. CORY, C. M. G. TO WILLIAM OF HOHENZOLLERN, MURDERER, RAPIST AND DESTROYER OF DEFENSELESS WOMEN AND CHILDREN.

One billion, four hundred and eighty thousands of persons, practically every human being, not of German blood and many human beings of German blood pray every day that the House of Hohenzollern and all that it stands for shall be wiped from the earth.

No creature living or dead, has ever inspired one one-thousandth part of the hatred that you have inspired. You will, if the world is not in error, hold a unique place in history as the most hated of all things that have lived to the 18th year of the 20th century. A. D. and probably as the most hated thing that ever will live. It is impossible to conceive that any creature or creature thing can exceed you in commission of crimes calculated to excite human hatred and contempt. How do you go to sleep at night and then evolve the almost unimaginable and almost unevolvable empire of crime which you are charged of having inflicted upon the world? What was your original idea? What did you think? Had you any remote idea that your forcing of war upon the world would result in the ruin which Europe faces today? Had you any remote idea that of the 1,500,000,000 human beings of all sorts upon the face of the earth, 1,420,000,000 would hate your name, hate your race, hate your soul and would be willing to lay down every one of their 1,420,000,000 individual lives rather than that your power should prevail above one of them?

How do you go to sleep at night? Does the knowledge that you are accused of having already destroyed 3,000,000 German lives upon the field of battle and probably 4,000,000 other German lives as the direct result of the war destroyed the lives of 3,000,000 French in and out of battle of 1,500,000 British, of 1,000,000 Turks, Armenians and Syrians of probably 10,000,000 Slaves in war as the direct result of war, interfere with your slumber? Do the stumped arms of little children reach out to you in your dreams? Do the horror-stretched eyes of outraged women haunt you in your sleep? Do the sons of Germany whom you have doomed to death, as surely as you have doomed their agonized Armenian or the hell-condemned Belgian, reproach you in the darkness? Do the souls of unborn children cry to you at midnight as the souls of their mothers cried when the bayonets of your Prussians pierced them? And do the myriad souls of little children that might have been born of the multitudes of you that you have killed crowd about you in the gloaming and cry: 'Oh, Kaiser! but for you we might have had fathers and might have had mothers and might have been born of love and lived in love and seen God.

THE DELICATE AND IMPORTANT WORK OF MAKING ARMY MAPS

The process of making maps whereby military operations can be carried out is not so comparatively simple as it once was. Neither is it so crude and restricted. The topographical division of the American Expeditionary Forces has been organizing and training for months now in France, and maps containing the work of American engineers are already being supplied to the American staff and field officers. Of course, it has not been like blazing trails in a wilderness. The ground has already been very thoroughly covered and French army maps and civil records from local sources form a basis. But map making has to be kept scrupulously up to date. Robert K. Tomlin, Jr., who is acting as war correspondent for 'The Engineering News-Record,' has an article in the May 23 issue of that publication, in which he says: 'The topographical division must be able to furnish at quick notice maps of enemy ground and also that occupied by our own troops, the latter including not only the advance areas but also the territory in the rear, such as sites of supply bases, hospitals, aviation training stations, artillery and machine gun ranges, storage yards and camp areas. Obviously, it would be difficult if not impossible, for a single detached organization to do the field and air work necessary for the production of all of these maps, especially on an extended front. The plan is, therefore, to have each army map the territory along its own front, while the topographical division of the intelligence section, a headquarters unit, acts as the general clearing house for map information and outlines the broad questions of policy by which the special map-making forces in each army are guided. Its work involves, of course, very close cooperation with the air service.'

Modern battle maps would probably be impossible without the eagle eyes of the air. Mr. Tomlin thinks that for the most valuable source of information for making maps of forward areas is the aerial photograph. But of course, this is a subject about which very few details can be given out. This correspondent writes: 'The work divides itself into three phases, the taking of the picture, its interpretation after development and reconstruction of the data in map form. Our topographical division has developed a force of specially trained

men for the last two steps of this work, which calls for the highest type of technical skill, long experience and thorough familiarity with almost everything connected with modern warfare. To the uninitiated some of these pictures would be absolutely meaningless. Often the exposures are made at great heights, when machines are forced upward by anti-aircraft fire; conditions of light may be poor; the machine not be flying horizontally when the exposure is made, causing distortion in distances. In fact, scores of variable factors enter into the work, and the interpreter of photographs taken in the air must be a man of seasoned judgment, able to evaluate each streak or spot and discover its true meaning. His work is made doubly difficult by attempts to camouflage the positions of enemy guns. The photograph reader, therefore, must be a student of camouflage in all of its many variations. After a picture is made, no attempt is made to enlarge or reduce it to some uniform scale. It is put under lenses of high power, as well as stereoscopes, which bring the details out in relief, and the man who reads its message must be able to make the proper allowances for the height at which the exposure was made. The usual height for taking a picture from an airplane for map purposes, I was told, is 2,500 meters.'

Lance-Corporal Horace Hills, Suffolk, says: 'Five or six thousand Italians came in. They had travelled three or four days, and had had nothing at all to eat. After they arrived soup was brought in, and as they were starving they rushed at it. The Germans then dashed forward and stabbed at them with their swords and bayonets, and killed and wounded a lot. Seven or eight Italians were dying of starvation every day in camp. They had no parcels. I saw one Englishman give an Italian bread, and the Italian went down on his knees and kissed his hands.'
