NO BOUNDARY BILL FORTHCOMING THIS YEAR.

Although Parliament last year by resolution endorsed the proposed extension of the boundaries of Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba, it cannot take effect to give those Provinces possession until a formal bill is passed at Ottawa. It was intended the bill should pass at this session, but this will not be. Legislation affecting the boundary of any Province, even when it extends such boundary, requires the consent of the Provincial Legislature. Therein lies the cause of the delay in bringing in the boundary bill. Neither Ontario nor Manitoba will consent to the boundaries provisionally offered them, large as is the allotment proposed. They both want more.

Ontario and Manitoba are both under Conservative Governments at present, and hence are sharply on the look out for all that is coming to them in any new deal proposed by the Liberal Government at Ottawa. They see the almost continental area that is to be allotted to Quebec and their appetite for territory is stimulated. Wherefore Ontario demands more mileage and a broader frontage on Hudson's Bay, and Manitoba wants not only a bigger slice of Keewatin than Sir Wilfrid proposes to give, but wants a big cash subsidy thrown in to pay for the new responsibilities to be incurred and to equalize her dowry with those bestowed upon Alberta and Saskatchewan.

It's a very pretty game as it stands and the stakes are high. In the meantime the delay may prove a good thing by way of exemplifying the musty proverb that when a certain class of persons fall out, honest people stand a chance to get their due. If the big land grab goes over for another year the chances are that the Maritime Provinces may wake up to such an emphatic demand for compensation that a second halt may be called. There is not a great power on the continent of Europe that would not go to war at peril of its national destruction, for a tenth part of as much territory as is in the smallest of the allotments to any of the three big central Provinces. And now the Ottawa Parliament has a Daylight Bill before it introduced by Mr. Lewis, M. P. It provides that from April 30 to Oct. 31 local time shall be one hour in advance of standard time, but that this shall not interfere with navigation and astronomy, in which lines Greenwich time will remain in use as heretofore. The bill also is now to apply to the Yukon country, where the solar day sometimes lasts for weeks. Despatches sent to the American papers from Hamilton would indicate that the crown's theory of the Kinrade murder is that Florence Kinrade killed her sister. The Toronto World's Hamilton correspondent says this is not the crown theory, which lies in quite another direction. The prosecutor believes her entirely innocent, this correspondent says.

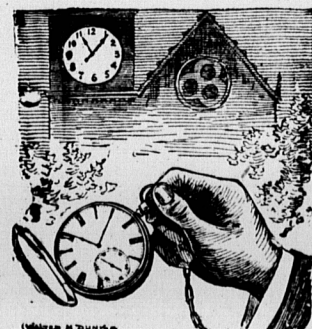
