WISH OF A DYING GIRL

Syracuse, Feb. 8.—Only five brief hours of married life were allotted to Charlotte Noor of this city, who up to last year was private secretary to former Lieutenant Governor Timothy L. Woodruff. Her engagement to Ernest H. West, also in Mr. Woodruff's employ, was announced some months ago, after she had resigned her position because of falling health.

It had been hoped that the young woman—who was popular among the officers and employees of the Woodruff concern—would return soon to her position, but she grew steadily worse. When it was seen there was no hope for her recovery the wedding was decided upon.

Yesterday the attending physician announced that Miss Noor could not survive the night, and plans were made for an immediate ceremony. Rev. Mr. Glandring was asked to come to the home and the wedding rites were performed.

Mr. Glandring said he never was called upon to perform a marriage ceremony under such mournful circumstances, and yet the dying woman seemed to be happy. She had hoped to live to see Mr. West's wife but knowing that this could never be she was happy that she could die as his wife.

The clergyman with difficulty read the words that made man and wife. The weeping of the broken-hearted family and the grief of the husband so soon to be bereaved were features of a wedding never to be forgotten, said Mr. Glandring. The bride bore up bravely and died with a smile on her lips, her hand clasped in her husband's.
