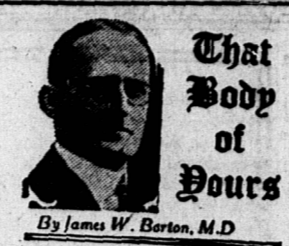

Notes By The Way

The admitted difficulties of enforcing any liquor law that is strongly restrictive are very great. That fact has led Senator Sheppard, of Texas, to bring forward a proposal that the Volstead Act shall be so amended as to make the buyer equally guilty with the seller in all sales of liquor used as a beverage.

The newspapers throughout the country and their correspondents have taken up the new question and are discussing it with vigor. The Literary Digest publishes the portraits of three of the front-rank prohibition leaders who favor Senator Sheppard's proposal, and the portraits of three other equally prominent prohibitionist leaders who oppose it.

Premier King is having a hard time under discouraging conditions in Prairie Land. Saskatchewan had just been lost to Liberalism before he set out westward and that disaster was quickly followed after he had arrived by the crushing defeat of the Liberal forces in Ontario.

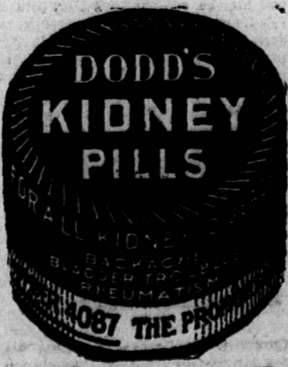
