BY-LAWS

Allowing Discount City of Charlottetown

A By-law for allowing the rate of discount on the Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general Civic purposes for the current year ending the 31st day of December A. D. 1909.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, as follows:— 1st. A Discount, at the rate of Two and One-half per cent (2 1/2 pc) shall be allowed to all Taxpayers who shall, on or before the 20th day of July, A. D. 1909, pay the City Clerk, at his office, the Taxes several y due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for Civic purposes.

...The chapter we read that Christ and the twelve, some six months before his death, were in the vicinity of Mount Hurrion where Peter made the good confession for which he was so highly commended by his master.

In the same connection we have the statement made by Christ, for the first time, that he was soon to suffer death at the hands of the rulers in Jerusalem, Peter's rebuke administered to him for so thinking, and the strange rebuke administered to Peter for his presumption in thus daring to dispute to his divine master.

Then in harmony with the statement of what he himself had to pass, our Lord informs his disciples that the conditions of discipleship were self-denial and cross-bearing; and that to be his true followers would often require the laying down of life itself for his sake.

Then to encourage their now sad hearts at the thought of his death, he carries the minds of these disciples forward to a time when he would come back to earth in glory to reward them and all others for their sacrifices. He then closes this discourse in the words of the text that there were some that present who would not taste of death until they should see the Son of Man coming in his Kingdom.

This "coming in his Kingdom" cannot mean the setting up of his kingdom as we now have it for all of these disciples witnessed that upon earth.

The coming of his kingdom, so often spoken of in the parables, must not be confounded with the expression "coming in his kingdom."

The transfiguration scene, which occurred six days after the statement made in the text, and which is fully related in the next chapter is evidently the fulfillment of that statement.

The "Some standing here" were evidently the chosen three who were with our Lord on "the holy Mount." In the transfiguration scene those men had a perfect representation of the glorious and everlasting Kingdom, when the affairs of this world shall be wound up and the saints glorified in heaven.

Their reasons for this most singular demonstration on Mount Hurrion, first, this favour himself needed sympathy and encouragement. So completely had his best friends failed to give him what his heart was breaking for that even while he was praying, the three best disciples had fallen asleep. As in the garden, in his last dark hour, heavenly messengers were sent to strengthen him. Second His disciples then and in all ages needed such a proof of his divine majesty. And Peter so uses it in one of his letters. Third, the scene was needed to enable Moses and Elijah, the law giver and the law restorer, to come and lay their authority and honors down at the feet of the worlds great teacher.

STEAMERS COLLIDE.

SAUL STEPHENSON, Michigan, July 13.—Three minutes after the steel steamers "Isaac Scott" and "John Cowie" had collided in Lake Superior off White Fish Point Lighthouse, the Cowie went to the bottom in fifty fathoms of water carrying with her fourteen members of the crew. The Isaac Scott, although badly damaged about the bows, put back to port where she arrived with part of the crew of the John Cowie. A heavy fog was responsible for the collision.

The Isaac Scott, a new boat, was on her maiden trip to the head of the Lakes and had just straightened her course up the lake when the John Cowie loomed up through the fog only a few feet away. She was down bound with 8,000 tons of iron ore in her hold. The ships were so close it was impossible to avoid the collision. For fifteen feet the bow of the Isaac Scott penetrated the Cowie. Tons of water rushed into the great opening and in three minutes the Cowie had settled to the bottom.
