(Continued From Page 1) which contact has been maintained between the central office and the many shipping clubs.

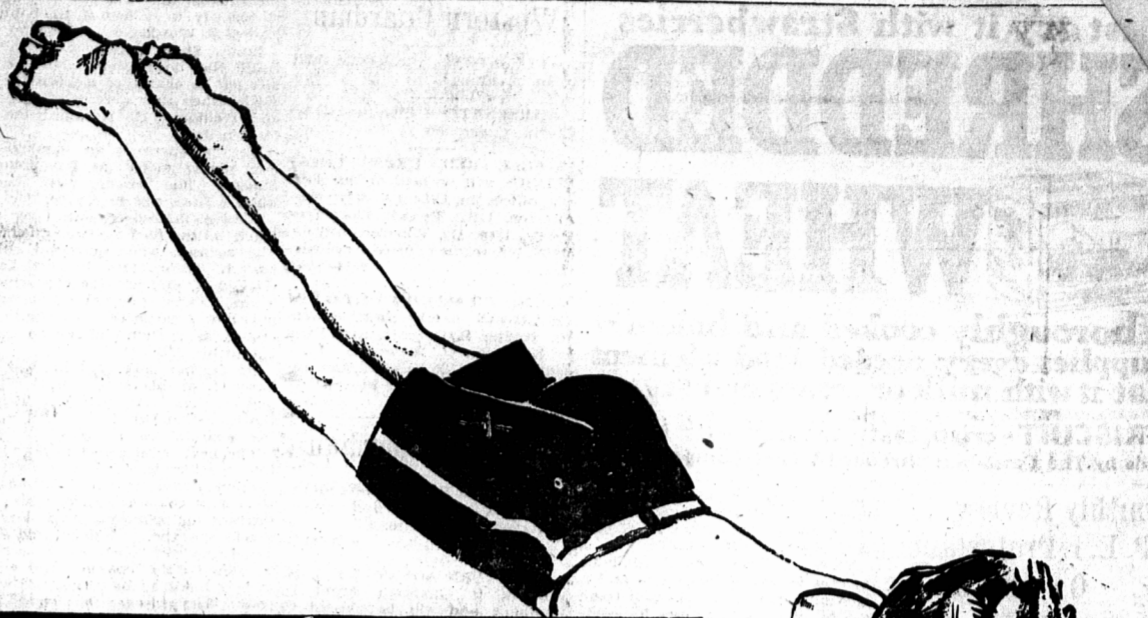
Good Demand /Our hogs and lambs are in keen demand. We have a good article to sell.

The address of J. K. King, of Moncton, manager of the Maritime Livestock Board, was in part as follows: "The more or less independent livestock shipping clubs in 1926 handled livestock with a total value of \$325,000, while for the last year the Maritime Livestock Board marketed livestock that had a total value of \$52,637.06, an increase over the previous year of 70 per cent."
