OTTAWA, Aug. 11.—A powerful steamer that is being built in the Vickers-Maxim yards in England for the Department of Marine, will be launched on Aug. 21, and will probably reach Canada early in the fall. She is intended for use in the St. Lawrence channel below Montreal, and will be available for ice-breaking during the winter. 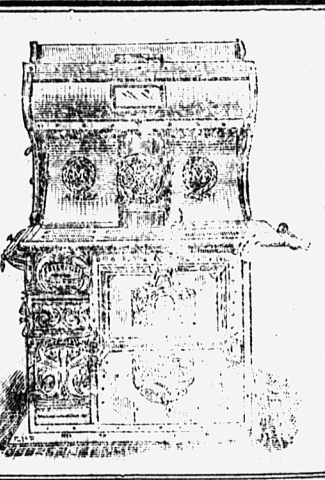
