QUEER FOOD IN EUROPE.

Black Rubber and Silk Chopped Up to Simulate Truffles.

In a report on the subject of food adulteration in Europe, Consul General Guenther at Frankfurt makes the following statements:

An article on the adulteration of food products is going the rounds of the German press. It is stated, for instance, that an ordinary liver patty is made into fine "Strassburger" pate de foie gras (goose liver patty) by means of borax or salicylic acid and of finely chopped and cleverly distributed pieces of black silk, representing truffles.

Cosmos, a German paper, guarantees the fact that under the label of canned lobsters the soft parts of the cuttlefish and crabs are sold.

In Paris snails are of late very popular, and the adulterators mix them with lungs of cattle and horses. Even entirely artificial snails are manufactured. The shells, recast with fat and slime, are filled with lung and then sold as "Burgundy" snails.

Lovers of fresh rooster combs are imposed upon by a substitute cut out of hogs' intestines.

Chopped artificial truffles are made of black rubber, silk or softened leather, and even whole truffles are made out of roasted potatoes, which are given a peculiar flavor by adding ether. They are said to sell well.

Fish spoiled in spite of ice and borax is treated with salts of zinc, aluminum and other metals. Rubbing the fish with vaseline to give it a fresh look and coloring the gills with fresh blood or eosin—a coal tar color—is resorted to. The latter is also used to intensify the red color of inferior crabs.

Imparting a greenish color to oysters is another adulteration. An oyster requires about one month in the beds to acquire the greenish color. As this is too long a time the dealers help them along with an artificial color.

The chemists in the Paris municipal laboratories have shown that tomato jelly is adulterated with turpines, and powdered pepper contains a large admixture of powdered hard tack.—Washington Star.

The Kaiser's Pipe.

The German emperor seems bent on breaking fresh ground in every direction, for we learn that on going ashore at Helgoland the other day he was wearing oilskins and "smoking a short pipe"—probably a French brier, unless indeed it may have been an Irish clay cutty. This is quite a new departure. Like his majesty's recent assumption of a pince-nez when reading newspapers in the train. When he began his reign the kaiser smoked nothing but cigarettes—very long and big ones they were, and from these he gradually ascended to light Dutch cigars, almost of straw color, costing a penny each.

Now he has taken to a pipe such as may be seen between the teeth of yachtsmen at Cowes. His father, the Emperor Frederick, took his tobacco in a porcelain pipe of the student type. The old emperor, on the other hand, true to the tradition of his youth, never went beyond raising a cigarette to his lips at military messes and shooting parties as a signal to the rest of the company that they might now light up.—Exchange.

Rare Coins For Philadelphia.

Philadelphia will soon possess two of the rarest coins known to exist. They are the famous silver dollars of 1794. One is at present in the Philadelphia mint, and the other was purchased recently by Henry Chapman, Jr., numismatist.

The latter coin was bought by Mr. Chapman at the sale of the Murdock collection of coins and tokens held in London.

The dollar purchased by Mr. Chapman surpasses the similar coin at the mint in perfection and fineness.

Mr. Chapman wrote to the auctioneers in advance that he was willing to pay as high as \$500 for the coin. It was knocked down to him for \$240.

The 1794 dollar is similar in face appearance to the dollars now in circulation, having the medallion face on the front encircled with stars and the date. On the reverse is the spread eagle seated on the wreath.—Philadelphia North American.

The Limit of Train Speed.

A recent test of speed on the Pennsylvania railway proves conclusively that the accounts of trains attaining a speed of 100 miles an hour, even for a short distance, are apocryphal. Over a stretch of twenty-five miles of perfect track on the New Jersey and Seashore division the Pennsylvania officials ran a train with their fastest engines, and ninety miles an hour was the highest rate ever reached. One coach after another was dropped, and finally, with the engine alone, on several runs, ninety-five miles and one-tenth was the best that could be done. The distance was accurately measured, and the chronograph used in the tests was absolutely correct.

An Odd Horse Case.

A horse belonging to a Missouri man got a lump on its jaw three years ago. Its owner had a veterinary surgeon operate on the animal the other day, and he took out a hard, smooth substance about four inches long and an inch wide, resembling a white stone. Those who have examined it say it is a petrified corn-cob. The commonly accepted theory is that the horse, while eating, got a cob caught in its mouth, which slowly worked its way into his jaw until it lodged just beneath the skin. The animal never seemed to suffer from its presence.

An Involved Decision.

The magistrates of Fremantle, the principal port of Western Australia, have given a new and interesting decision in reference to stowaways, says The London Daily Chronicle. Five of these free trippers were brought to the bar and fined £3 each. Of course, they had not the wherewithal to pay, and the prosecuting lawyer asked for the alternative imposition of imprisonment. But the magistrates declined, unless the captain of the steamship would guarantee the cost of the maintenance of the men in jail. This he naturally refused to do, whereupon the stowaways were set free. The magistrates stated that stowaways are punished in the interests of shipping companies, and therefore these latter should bear the cost. They also expressed the opinion that vessels should be more diligently searched for stowaways before leaving port. The present practice of allowing crowds of friends of passengers to remain on board until almost the last minute facilitated the operations of stowaways.
