DEBATE IN WINDSLOE HALL.—For the sake of variety in the programme of the Young Peoples League a debate was held on Tuesday evening, Feb. 19th which proved to be a complete success. Both teams made animated speeches and advanced many conclusive and convincing arguments. The subject dealt with was "Resolved that success in life is due more to character than to circumstance." Miss Mamie Andrews opened the discussion for the affirmative and was supported by Mrs. C. Graham, Miss H. MacKay, and Mr. John Jones. The leader for the negative was Mr. Eric McNeill who was supported by Miss Margaret Cudmore, Mr. Brent Diamond, and Miss Mary McDonald. The net result was 27 points in favor of the affirmative team, and 12 for that of the negative.

WINNIPEG, Man., Feb. 21.—Radios carrying the latest news of the world into remote farm homes and hooking up pioneer prairie settlements with large cities, have become an important factor in colonization in the Dominion, according to a report issued by the Department of Marine. "The radio has robbed prairie farm life of its isolation," reads the report. "Loneliness is no longer to be dreaded. Settlers and their families listen-in on current news of the day, enjoy high class concerts and entertainments, receive information from agricultural colleges on new farming methods and courses in household management, and get the latest market quotations on agricultural products. "Of 100,000 receiving sets estimated to be in operation throughout the Dominion, more than 60 per cent are owned on farms. This is especially true in the prairie provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta. In Manitoba, the provincial government aids broadcasting through its publicly owned telephone system." Broadcasting stations in Canada number 38, the report shows, and are located in the principal cities from coast to coast. Investment in receiving sets amounts to more than \$2,000,000.

Allward, the Canadian Sculptor, who designed and will carry out the Memorial at Vimy Ridge. Both these gentlemen have gone north to select suitable stones for the Memorial.
