HALIFAX PASTORS FAVOR THE UNION Of Presbyterians, Methodists, Congregationalists.

A very interesting meeting was held in Halifax last Thursday evening, when the pastors and a number of the laymen of the Methodist and Presbyterian churches of the city met at the residence of A. M. Bell to discuss in an informal way the question of union.

Dr. Lathern, who twice has been the chairman of the conference committee on union, introduced the first resolution: "That the general conference of the Methodist church and the general assembly of the Presbyterian church, having pronounced strongly in favor of a proposal for the organic union of the Presbyterian, Congregational and Methodist churches, and an informal and unofficial meeting having been held in Toronto in furtherance of the movement, it was thought desirable to call a similar meeting in Halifax for the purpose of an informal expression of opinion on the subject of an united church."

Dr. Pollok supported the resolution and pointed out the essential unity of the two churches in polity - government - by Presbytery. This is carried out by similar organization, though under different names.

which the proposal had been received. No single note of protest in the press, from the pulpit, or on the streets has been read or heard.

Dr. H. W. Murray referred to the forefathers of union in the conference in the Y. M. C. A., the Provincial Sunday School association, and the movements for social reform. He felt that God was in the movement for union, and he spoke of the great importance of a union of the churches in the shaping of the future of the great West where the centre of political power will soon be.

Dr. Maclean spoke of the great need of the West. The year before last 100,000 immigrants entered Canada. Of this, four per cent, stayed in the maritime provinces, nine in Quebec, thirteen in Ontario, and seventy-four in the Northwest. Last year 125,000 arrived. This means that at least 100,000 extra men were required each year.

Dr. Robert Murray, whose hymn, "Our Blessed Bond of Union," has been sung and was more eloquent than speech, in a few words expressed warm sympathy with anything that made for the organic union of the two churches.
