FANATIC CAUGHT WHO INTENDED TO SHOOT THE KING

Man Who Took Part in Jamestown Raid Arrested in Chippenham

LONDON, Oct. 30.—A man who gave the name of John Pearce, was arrested a few days ago after a struggle with the police and the keepers of Chippenham Park, where the King has been shooting during the past week, and where the Prince of Wales will shoot on Monday. Pearce stated that he had been sent to 'shoot the gentleman who has come here to kill game.' He added: 'I am going to shoot him before he leaves.' He was examined by the police, but refused to give any particulars of himself. Papers found in his possession indicate that he took part in the famous raid of Dr. Jameson in South Africa, and that he thinks he has some grievance against the King.

POTATO CROPS A BIG FAILURE IN HARTLAND N.B.

Means a Loss of 200,000 to the Farmers Thereabout In Hartland N. B.

HARTLAND, N. B., Oct. 30.—The continued cold weather has finished the potato crop, and from the past week's frost the farmers of this country stand to lose fully \$200,000. The total potato acreage is estimated at 15,000 acres, from which, without the intervention of rot and frost, 150,000 barrels should have been gathered. The rot reduced the yield by sixty per cent; therefore, the good potatoes actually raised amounted to approximately 60,000 barrels, of which perhaps 40,000 barrels have been dug. The remainder are where they will remain until next spring, when it is hoped they can be turned out and used for seed.

WILL THE G.T.R. GIVE 3RD CLASS AT TWO CENTS?

Is it Bound by Charter to Provide Third-Class Accommodation.

OTTAWA, Oct. 30.—Argument is proceeding before the Supreme Court today upon the question as to whether the Grand Trunk Railway is or is not bound by its charter to provide third-class passenger accommodation on its line at the rate of a penny (two cents) a mile. The Railway Commission has ruled that the company is so bound, and the latter appeals to the Supreme Court, claiming that the obligation imposed upon it in this matter by its act of incorporation was repealed by chapter 26 of the acts of the Dominion Parliament of the session of 1883, which allowed a variation of tolls.

LOT OF MONEY GATHERED IN FROM CHINESE

A Total Revenue of \$391,000 From Poll Tax Since January

OTTAWA, Oct. 30.—Returns to the Department of Trade and Commerce show that 782 Chinese entering Canada have paid the \$500 poll tax since January, which means a revenue of \$391,000 from this source for the Federal Government. At the present rate the Chinese immigration for the year may easily total 1,000. This is of course exclusive of students and merchants from whom no poll tax is collected. Last year there were but 22 who paid the poll tax and the year before only eight. The immigration, therefore, is coming back to the proportions that it had attained before the tax was raised to its present rate. The immigration of Chinese into Canada, in 1904, when the poll tax amounted to \$100, was 4,917. There would seem to be some agency at work bringing Chinese into British Columbia during the present season, and no doubt, advancing the \$500 for payment of the poll tax until the newcomer has realized enough money to repay this loan.

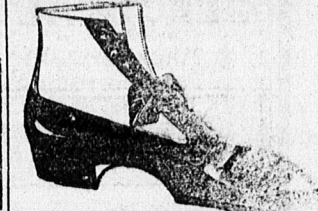
