SIR WILFRID'S LETTER

Sir,—The letter of Sir Wilfrid Laurier in reply to the Secretary of the "Win-the-War" League seems to me to contain no well sustained statement of fact but merely a shifty special pleading defense of a false position which, if not actually disloyal, is certainly devoid of hearty unswerving loyalty, except lip loyalty of which he has a stock.
I will not take up your space with detailed remarks on the letters but will quote paragraph No. 3 which says: "To organize a vigorous and compact system of voluntary enlistment concurred and carried out on strictly non-partisan and broadly national methods." This like all Sir Wilfrid says, reads well, but I wish to ask a question.
The great body of the inhabitants of Quebec are of French descent; when the war broke out everyone expected to see them tumbling over each other in their eagerness to get to the recruiting station to enlist in defence of France, the beloved country of their origin invaded by the ruthless and powerful German nation! As a matter of fact they have made no move.
Now I ask why this people with a two-fold incentive to enlist, first in their duty to the Empire of which they form a part, and next in their love of France from which their ancestors came, should require a "vigorous and compact system of voluntary enlistment" to induce them to perform a duty to which they were doubly called, while all the other provinces from Vancouver, B. C., in the west to Sydney, N. S., in the east readily gave their brave boys to fight in defence of the Empire and liberty?
There is a mystery here which perhaps Sir Wilfrid can explain.


