WORLD'S HIGHEST BOWLING SCORE

Once in a while bowling fans cheering their favorites on to victory or defeat in one of their nightly matches, are treated to exceptional enthusiasm when some one of the 24 rollers topples the pins with as much luck as precision and amasses a particularly high score.

Now and then one reads in the papers how the anchor man on some team gets the big mark of the night with a single string of 114 or some crackup in another bowling game amasses a three string total of 316 or more.

These figures represent good bowling and accuracy of shot and aim. For it is beyond dispute that a man is rolling well when he makes over 100 in a string of candle pins, and any one who gets up in the vicinity of 114 comes pretty near hitting the magic stick continually on the target. Judge what a sensation was created in Boston bowling circles one night last week then, when Paul Poehler, one of the greatest bowlers that ever took a shot at the king pin or set the fans shaking by the "crack" of a seemingly-impossible score, sent all records toppling over the wonderful string of 114, made on the Boston alleys on Arch street.

This score was not made in a match game, and it seems too head-bore for it was made in competition to the alleys of which Poehler is in charge. Poehler's competitor by the way, was a roller of more than ordinary ability, a man who always plays to win, but who was compelled before the string was laid way through to practically relinquish opposition, while he himself joined the ranks of those who were rooting for Poehler to make a record string.

The start that Poehler made was not an auspicious one for he got a half second box was better, for he brought up a nice three-pin spare and had something tangible to work on. The third box was really the start for he topped the slender sticks for a strike making his total for two boxes 21 and giving him ten more for the third box and two balls to count. Worcester in the first box was lucky to get away with a first spare in the fourth box gave him 14 for three.

Then followed three strikes in succession. At the end of the sixth box Poehler had rolled up the phenomenal score of 162. It was a practical certainty now that a world record would be set, and those who were rolling on other alleys stopped all arguments and rushed out to witness the climax of the wonderful string.

Over zealotry and a little hard luck was Poehler's portion in the sixth box. With a possible spare in sight he crossed his ball just a trifle too much to one side of the center. This gave him a bad split and the best he could do was nine.

This made his total 174 for nine boxes, but there was but one chance left in the tenth and final box to be brought up a remarkable 41.

MONTREAL TO HAVE \$4,000,000 FLOATING DOCK. (Montreal Herald, Dec 29.)

Speaking at the Commercial Travellers' banquet in the Windsor hotel last night, C. O. Ballantyne, the chairman of the harbor commission, officially declared that Montreal would have a first class dry dock of at least 25,000 tons lifting capacity. He further declared that the dock would be built by a large British firm, and that in addition to the dock a large ship repairing plant would be provided equal to any of the largest ship repairing plants in Great Britain.

This morning Mr. Ballantyne explained to the Herald that the commission had not been in a position to definitely announce their plans until the present. But there seemed to be such a lot of discussion in connection with the dry dock question that those connected with the dry dock plans had come to the conclusion to announce that Montreal was to have a dry dock.

Last spring Mr. Ballantyne explained the harbor commissioners had started to prepare a site for a first class dry dock at a place known as Moisson's Creek at Longue Pointe. Six acres of the plan site were already prepared and the work was progressing rapidly.

By next September the work would all be in position and the dry dock placed in position.

"This floating dry dock," Mr. Ballantyne said, "will be built by a British firm. In addition to the dock itself, a first class ship repairing plant with an equipment capable of dealing with vessels as well as the largest repairing plants of Great Britain."

It is well understood that a dry dock of itself would not be a paying proposition. The harbor commissioners, therefore, will have linked up with this dry dock a ship-repairing plant and a large industrial establishment. The harbor commissioners have always taken this stand with the dominion government, that if there was only going to be one dry dock on the St. Lawrence, Quebec was the place for it, but the harbor commissioners felt that the importance of the port of Montreal, where lake and ocean navigation meet, warranted a first class floating dock. I hope Quebec will also have a dock, but I have no authority on that point.

It has transpired that Albert Vickers, chairman of Vickers Sons & Maxim Limited, was here in connection with the scheme in June last. Only a few weeks ago Sir Trevor Dawson, managing director of the company, was also here and spent some time with the commissioners, going over the work. A company, it is reported, will be formed under the name of "Canadian Vickers Company Limited," with a capital of \$15,000,000.
