SPORTING NEWS

CANADIANS AT BISLEY

LONDON, July 21.—Delightful conditions, with an entire absence of wind, and the barometer rising, marked the opening of to-day's shooting.

The big events for Canadians are the Duke of Cambridge competition and the Kolaro cup shooting. For the latter, Canada's team has been selected as follows:

Col-Sergeant Stoddart, Hamilton. Sergeant Martin, Calgary. Q. M. S. McInnes, Edmonton. Sergeant Russell, Ottawa. Sergeant Bullock, Toronto. Private Emslie, Toronto.

Sergeant Armstrong, Halifax. In the Alexandra competition Canada is absent till the twenty-fourth place, where Emslie wins one hundred shillings; Russell wins a like sum; Stoddart, Noble, Armstrong, Hawkins, Neale, Bullock and McInnes, each even, sixty shillings; McCoy, Graham, Hendry and Bo, each get forty shillings; Riddell and Brooks each receive twenty shillings.

In the Prince of Wales contest, Bullock was seventeenth; Martin, twenty-first; Laman, twenty-seventh; Russell, fifty-first, and Stoddart, fifty-second, each getting forty shillings.

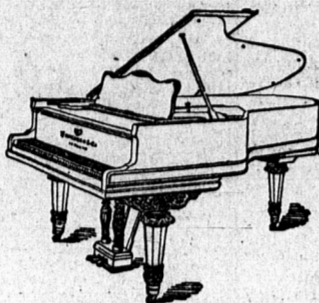
The Canadian scores in the Duke of Cambridge competition were:

Canada made 255; India, 270, and Guernsey, 241.

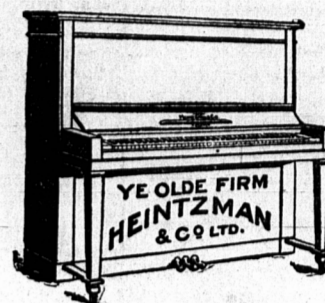
