NOW IN BARRACKS.—No. 5 Siege Artillery Draft and the 105th Battalion reinforcements are now quartered at the Armouries. The artillery draft has now a strength of thirty men and the infantry about thirty-five.

ENGAGEMENT ANNOUNCED.—Mr. and Mrs. James L. Mullen announce the engagement of their daughter Stella Marie, to Francis P. Hennessy, the marriage to take place on Nov. 27th at St. Dunstan's Cathedral.

PROSPEROUS FOX CO.—The Pavilion Fox Co. Ltd. is another one of the fox companies paying a substantial dividend this year. They paid last week 2 per cent. cash dividend, and expect to pay a further dividend later in the season. This company was organized in 1914 with four pairs of foxes. This year they had 78 foxes in their ranch—a natural increase of 70 foxes, none being bought after the original four pairs. The company intend to retain 17 for breeding purposes.

LAI D TO REST.—A large number of citizens turned out yesterday afternoon to pay their last tribute of respect to the memory of Mrs. Matilda M. Irving, Rev. Dr. Fullerton officiated at the services at the house and grave. The remains were laid to rest in Sherwood Cemetery. The pall bearers were Messrs. Charles Dalziel, A. E. Morrison, John Godkin, A. A. McLean, J. E. Bell and John White.

STATION AGENT AT SUMMER SIDE.—Mr. William M. Flynn, Station Master at Georgetown has been appointed Station Master at Summerside in succession to Mr. T. B. Grady who was recently appointed Superintendent of the P. E. I. Railway. Mr. Flynn has been in the service of the Island Railway for the last twenty-five years, holding successively the position of station master at Royalty Junction, Cardigan and Georgetown. He has always been courteous and obliging and has proved himself an excellent official. It is not announced yet who will be his successor at Georgetown.

DANGEROUS COASTING.—Quite a number of small boys and girls are engaged in the lively sport of coasting down the steep hill at the foot of Great George Street leading to the Steam Navigation Wharf. This is a great fun but is very dangerous as the coasters are very liable to get badly injured or possibly killed by colliding with one of the many teams which are constantly coming up from the Marine Wharf and cannot be seen until they emerge around the Steam Navigation Co's office building.

THE CAR FERRY STEAMER.—Advice from Pictou yesterday morning stated that there were seventeen island car-loads of potatoes still in the car ferry steamer which it was expected would be removed by the close of the day. This freight was being removed as quickly as refrigerator cars could be secured to contain them. The steamer will today start loading the several car-loads of miscellaneous freight waiting at Pictou for this side. She is expected to arrive here on Friday, when she will load all the freight waiting at Charlottetown, making her last trip prior to laying up for some time to have the new heating installed.
