Mixed Trend On New York Stock Market

BY FREDERICK GARDNER Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, April 2 (AP)—In the speediest and jumpiest weekend session for more than a year, the stock market overrode heavy selling Saturday to close with recoveries of 1 to more than 2 points. Canada securities steadied. International Nickel advanced 1 3/4 points to 47 3/4 and Dome a point to 32 1/2 while Distillers, Dominion Stores, McInyre and Walkers improved fractionally. Imperial Oil and Massey Harris were easy. The turnover of 1,558,439 shares was the largest for a two-hour day since Oct. 23, 1937. It compared with 439,270 a week ago. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up .6 of a point at 45.8, but on the week this composite showed a net loss of 3.3 points. Prominent on the upward reversal were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, Douglas Aircraft, Sperry, U. S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, American Telephone, Consolidated Ed in Cdn, Anaconda, American Smelting, Du Pont, Johnsonville, Philip Morris, Santa Fe, N. Y. Central, Great Northern and general Electric. Allied chemical dropped 5 points at 160 and Dow Chemical was off 5 3/8 at 118 1/8. Lesser declines were recorded for Fastman Kodak, U. S. Gypsum, J. I. Case, Westinghouse and American Can.

WINNIPEG, April 2 (CP)—European political tension was reflected on the Winnipeg grain exchange Saturday as wheat futures prices fluctuated narrowly in nervous trading. Export business in Canadian wheat was estimated at around 100,000 bushels worked from both seaboard. Final quotations were 3-8 1/8 cent banking quarters closed the week ending with May at 60 7/8, July 61 1/2 and Oct. 62 1/2 cent. Liverpool advanced 3-8 1/2-2d. Chicago closed 1-4 1/2-2 cent down while Buenos Aires was unchanged to 3-8 cent higher.

Currencies

NEW YORK, April 2 (AP)—International money markets rolled almost to a full stop Saturday while banking quarters closed the week studying implications of the Hitler address. The French franc eased .001-8 of a cent to 2.64 3/4. Sterling was unchanged at 4.83 1/8 and Canadian funds at a discount of 29-64 compared with 15-32 on Saturday. The Netherlands guilder moved downward and other currencies were unchanged.

JACK MINER'S ROBIN (By The Canadian Press) KINGSVILLE, Ont.—Naturalist Jack Miner has received word from C. C. Atwood of Lakeland, Fla., of the death there in March this year of a robin tagged at the Miner sanctuary here in 1934. Canada's catch of clams has averaged about 70,000 barrels annually during the past three years, in addition to some 3,190 barrels of quahaugs or hard-shell clams. About half of the catch is marketed fresh and the remainder canned.
