**FIRST DOMINION Y. M. C. A. CONVENTION**

Described by W. S. Louson and Herbert Moule at the Y. M. C. A. Yesterday—The Great Work Being Done By that Organization Throughout The World.

Association Hall was well filled yesterday afternoon, and upon the platform were a number of the officers of the Young Men's Christian Association. Present W. S. Louson, who was president at the 1st Dominion Conference held recently in Montreal gave a short report of that meeting and Secretary Moule spoke upon the great importance of the Boys' Work.

The Y. M. C. A. male quartet gave an excellent sacred selection, and the entire service was inspiring and helpful.

Before Mr. Louson delivered his report he referred briefly to the deep spiritual movement now moving evangelical demonstrations throughout the world, that this wave of prayer and heart searching before Almighty God had already reached Canada and in Montreal ministers, laymen, Y. M. C. A. and Salvation Army alike, were expecting showers of spiritual blessings. In many of the churches prayer meetings are held every day of the week and special sermons are being delivered. "We are glad to notice the same spirit coming to Charlottetown," he said, "let every Christian be in the spirit of prayer."

In regard to the Dominion Conference Mr. Louson said in part. It may be of interest to some present to say that over 60 years ago, twelve young men under the leadership of George Williams, a farmer's son of 23 years of age, met together in a wholesale warehouse in London, England, to pray. They prayed that God would not only make them a blessing but that they might help other young men to Christ. Is it any wonder then, that from such a small beginning the Y. M. C. A. movement has extended its influence around the world. The first Association has now spread to 7,600 centres. The property owned represents over 30,000,000 of dollars, and its influence has always been, and by divine help pays to be, first, spiritual, social, physical, intellectual. So far reaching is this work that the New York Association has 33 different departments, and the Chicago, 25. The George Williams of 23 years, is now Sir George Williams, upwards of 83 years, head of the firm he represents and still working for the best interests of the Young Men's Christian Association.

The Dominion Conference recently held in Montreal was characterized by a deep spiritual feeling, and in entire sympathy with the wave of revival which has already reached our shores.

The following will interest the people of Charlottetown: Brandon, Man., with a population of 10,000 are building a \$50,000 building, and the farmers are largely contributing to the cause. Charlottetown has had an Association for nearly 50 years, has a population of 13,000 and there is still \$3,000 debt on building. Are there 3000 men or women who will make self denial to the extent of \$1 each and wipe off that debt this year? Canada has given more foreign secretaries than any other nation in the world.

Nearly 2000 students have gone out into the Foreign Mission Field in connection with the world wide movement of the Y. M. C. A.

The student movement is allowed access into the Government Colleges in Japan where neither Missionaries or Buddhist priests are allowed.

The Y. M. C. A. workers, at the front during the present war between Russia and Japan, have distributed large numbers of the Gospel of St. John, in Japanese language among the men in the firing line.

Over 200 delegates and business men

sat down to the evening session and banquet in King's Hall, Montreal. The addresses of Rev. Mr. Gordon (Ralph Connor) and John R. Mott, will ever be remembered by those present. The absence of a smoky atmosphere and spirituous liquors, and the singing of "Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian Love," at an up-to-date banquet are circumstances not easily to be forgotten. A delegation of the Maritime Association, will meet in Charlottetown early in September, when it is expected several members of the Dominion and American Associations will be present. We hope our association will be free of debt by that time.

Secretary Moule said in part: A noted leader in the Roman Catholic Church has said, "Give me the boy till he is 13 and I care not who has him afterwards." So much depends on the training received in childhood and particularly in the early days of adolescence that as hinted by the gentleman quoted the character is largely formed then. The Young Men's Christian Association has realized the truth of this and now, though originally organized for young men, extends its work back to the Boys' Department where it seeks to get hold of the boys and develop their threefold nature while yet it is plastic and before habits are formed which are bound to influence the whole character and life towards good or evil.

During the last five years there has been a wonderful development in the work of the boys' department; five years ago there were less than 20,000 boys enrolled in the association of North America, today there are 50,000 while in the same length of time the number of boys' secretaries has increased from 14 to 123 and thus only takes into account the men whose whole time is devoted to boys' work.

As might be expected the boys' department in world-wide Y. M. C. A. work has done good work in raising the senior membership roll over 40,000 having come up from the junior ranks. In this branch is the Association's greatest opportunity for evangelistic work as it has been definitely shown that by far the largest number of conversions occur between the ages of 12 and 19. While the value of the boys' work and the dividends it pays are realized to-day more than ever before too much emphasis cannot be placed on its importance. One of the signs of greatest promise for its future is the amount of study that is being made of boy nature. Association literature abounds with such articles as "The Boy Problem," "A Study of Adolescence" and kindred subjects, nor are these studies approached in a careless manner but in the great majority of cases are the result of scientific research.

Our Association in Charlottetown is more anxious than ever to reach out a helping hand to the boys, and bespeaks from the citizens their earnest support in making this branch of our work successful from every standpoint.

Our boys' meetings are held regularly at 10 a. m. each Sunday and have been steadily growing in attendance. A hearty invitation is extended to all boys to meet with us and enjoy these meetings.
