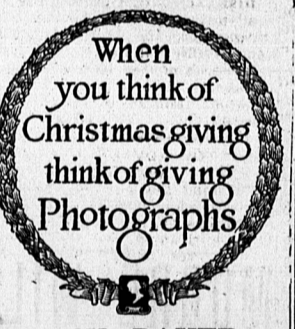

Place Names of Prince Edward Island

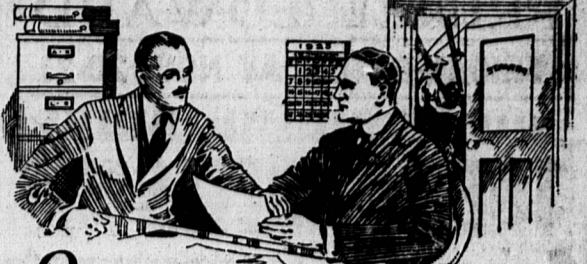
Guernsey; cove, lot 64. Name on plan, 1829. Lot 64 was settled by emigrants from Guernsey, Channel Islands, in 1806 and later years. It is said that the region was selected because well wooded, and being coopers, the settlers needed the wood in business; while it was also thought that land that would grow such large trees would when cleared give equally bountiful crops.

Haldimand; river, lot 15, Holland 765. After Colonel Sir Frederick Haldimand (1719-91), governor general of Canada (1778-86), an original officer of the Royal American regiment, which was also Haldimand; or after his nephew, Murray general Holland's assistant, who was drowned, while soundng at Louisbourg, December 16, 1765, in his 24th year.

Halliburton; settlement, lot 7, Meacham, 1880. Named by Robert Bruce Stewart, proprietor of the lot after Robert Grant Halliburton, son of Thomas Chandler Halliburton, (1796-1865) (Sam Slack), judge of the Supreme Court, N. S., R. C. Halliburton was R. B. Stewart's arbitrator under the Land Purchase Act of 1875. Halliburton thought he award unfair and refused to sign it.

Hampton; settlement with post office, lot 18. Name selected at a public meeting February 22, 1869, to replace the two names Oyster Cove and Shipyard. Hampton; settlement, lot 31. A post office April 1, 1897, to October 1, 1912.

Harmony; settlement, lot 13. The names dates from 1875 when a school district was formed. As the settlers got along peacefully, though of many nationalities—French, Irish, Highland Scottish, Lowland Scottish, English and Dutch—the name Harmony was selected; earlier known as Linefoot Road, because between lots 13 and 14.

FATTENING BROILERS.

Broilers are best suited for market when about 12 to 14 weeks old; that is, when they weigh from 3-4 of a pound to 2 lbs. When kept under free range conditions they grow rapidly but are not particularly fat. Just before being marketed, therefore, they should be fattened for about two weeks.
