AERONAUT FATALLY HURT

Hogan's Balloon Ropes Became Entangled with Wires.

NILES, Mich. Aug. 23.—In making an ascension here to-day William Hogan, the balloonist, was fatally injured.

Ropes from the balloon became tangled with telegraph wires and Hogan struck a sixty-foot building, breaking many bones. The balloon soared one hundred feet into the air and turned over, letting Hogan fall into the St. Joseph River.

Edward Wyant swam into midstream and rescued the aeronaut, who was unconscious. Hogan now lies in a hopeless condition.

Thousands of people who are here attending the carnival witnessed the accident.
