Livestock

MONTREAL, March 5—(CP)—There was a weaker undertone to hogs today on the Livestock market and other classes were steady.

Cattle were in good demand and sales were brisk. Good quality steers were sold at 12.25-12.50 with a few tops at 12.75. Medium good steers were around 12 and just mon steers were 8 up. Good heifers were mostly 10.50-11 and good cows 8.50-9.50, selling mostly at 6.50-Common butcher cows were 6.50-7.50 and canners and cutters 5-6-5. Good bulls sold up to 9.00 with commoner kinds going at 6.00-8.25.

Good calves were 15 with the bulk of the in-betweeners making 13-14. Drinkers were 10-12. Grass calves were slow at 6.50-7, the general price being 6.50.

Lambs, which were mostly bucks, sold between 11-11.50. Sheep were 3.50-7. Hogs were sold at 18.50 for grade A and 15.50-16. for sows.

CHICAGO, March 5—(AP)—May wheat soared as much as three cents and other grain futures markets were strong today on a wave of commission house buying and short covering.

Stimulating demand was announcement the commodity credit corporation is making more government-owned wheat available to the armed services for export and that the amount may reach 100,000,000 bushels within the next few months.

The program, not a new one, is regarded as especially significant because movement of such large stocks of grain would further aggravate the already acute freight shortage.

PROCLAMATION!

(Issued under the authority of the Emergency Shelter Regulations, Order-in-Council, P.C. 9439, December 19, 1944)

WARNING

TO ALL PERSONS PLANNING TO MOVE TO
Victoria · Vancouver · New Westminster
Hamilton · Toronto · Ottawa · Hull

As part of a plan to meet congested conditions, all persons who propose to rent or occupy family quarters in any of these Emergency Shelter Areas are required by Board order first to obtain a permit from the Administrator of Emergency Shelter for the district.

The purpose of the order is to help those who must be in these areas to obtain necessary accommodation.

Before completing arrangements to move to any of these districts, write to the Administrator for full particulars of the Emergency Shelter Regulations as they apply to that district.

THIS IS THE LAW

No person may move to and rent or occupy family quarters in any of these districts without an Administrator's permit (Form E.S. 1).

VICTORIA · VANCOUVER · NEW WESTMINSTER · TORONTO · HULL · HAMILTON · OTTAWA

Every person who rents or occupies family quarters in any of these districts contrary to the order, commits an offence and, in addition to other penalties, will be required by the Administrator to vacate the shelter and the district at his own expense.

The Emergency Shelter Regulations provide serious penalties for hindering or obstructing these efforts and for any contravention of the regulations or of an order of the Board or of the Administrators.
