METHODIST CHURCH DISTRICT CONVENTION

A District Convention of the Charlottetown District met in the Grace Methodist Church in this City on Thursday afternoon and held their sessions, concluding yesterday at noon.

The following ministers were present. Rev. William Harrison, chairman of the District; Rev. Thomas Marshall, Superintendent of Missions; Revs. H. E. Thomas, F. A. Wightman, J. M. Rice, L. J. Watson, George A. Sellars, Edward Bell, W. E. Johnson and D. R. Chowen.

Excellent papers on the following subjects were read and discussed. Modernism and its Lessons by Rev. H. E. Thomas. The present day outlook of the Christian Church by Rev. G. A. Sellars. The sermon that counts by Rev. J. M. Rice. The proposed organic union of the churches by Rev. Wm. Harrison. The religious value of the old testament by Rev. F. A. Wightman. The Pulpit and Politics by Rev. L. J. Watson. How to advance the Layman's Missionary movement among the Laymen in the district by Rev. W. E. Johnson. The paper read by Rev. Wm. Harrison was by order to be forwarded to the joint committee on church union.

Many matters of general interest were discussed which proved of much benefit to all present. The following resolution was unanimously adopted. In view of the very substantial and gratifying results achieved by the Moral and Social Reform League in the last federal election on the Island, and whilst fully recognizing the absolute necessity of a vigorous continuance of the best methods employed by the league in the recent campaign, it is the conviction of the Methodist Ministerial Convention now assembled in this City, that a very important and permanent auxiliary to the work outlined by the League, might be secured by the incorporation into the text books of our higher schools and colleges, of definite instructions regarding the duties and privileges of citizenship and we would therefore recommend to the proper authorities, that in this, or in some other manner, such a provision be made so that our young people may receive in their regular course, a training for citizenship in the Educational Institutions of our province.

TEN-YEAR-OLD BOY GETS A LIFE SENTENCE

SAVANNAH, Nov. 11.—Solomon Reilly, a negro boy, ten years of age, was yesterday convicted and given a life sentence for the murder of Mrs. Wilbur Torrence, at Hooler, near the city. Mrs. Torrence, for whom the boy had been working, discharged him and the following day he secured a shot gun, returned to her home and shot Mrs. Torrence, killing her instantly. The boy stated that he did the shooting because "she did not have any reason to fire me."

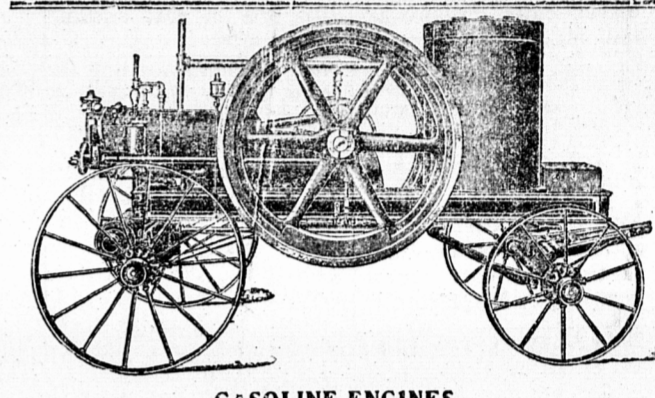

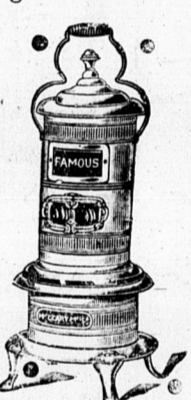
