NEW YORK, March 17—(CP)—Manager Red Dutton of New York Americans, accompanied by Art Chapman, his coach, headed for Western Canada tonight to look over his season's crop of amateur stars now engaged in the Allan and Memorial Cup playoffs.

Dutton's team, upon which he built high hopes at the opening of the National Hockey League season, finished a disastrous injury-ridden year when New York Rangers defeated them Sunday night. The Americans won only eight games in 48.

While the older members of the team prepared to head for their homes for the summer, the youngsters—those eligible for the American League playoffs—hastened to join Eddie Shore's team at Springfield.

Red has a promising crop with Springfield. They include youngsters who have been up with the Americans for part of the season but played enough American League games—17 or more—to qualify for the playoffs.

Bill Cowley Conceded N.H.L. Scoring Champ

MONTREAL, March 17—(CP)—Bill Cowley, who never sank far from the top of the scoring list during the season, and had a monopoly on first place during the last half of the playing schedule, was conceded the National Hockey League point-getting championship beyond a shadow of doubt tonight.

The great Boston play-maker has still one game to go, but already has amassed 60 points on 45 goals and a record-breaking 45 assists. That gives him a 16-point margin over four competitors grouped for second spot, all of whom have completed their regular season.

Syl Apps and Gordie Drillon of Toronto, and Bryan Hextall and Lynn Patrick ended their season in the four-way tie with 44 points each, but whether they hold down second spot or third in the standings depends largely on what Detroit's Syd Howe can do with the one remaining game he has in hand.

Howe is at present just one point behind the Apps-Drillon-Hextall-Patrick combination while another point behind him comes Neil Colville of Rangers. Bobby Bauer and Eddie Wiseman of Boston ended the season tied for eighth spot with 39 points each.

Hextall is just about conceded the goal-getting championship, with 26 to his credit. That gives him a two-point margin on Roy Conacher of Boston, and Sweeney Schriber of Toronto, but Conacher has one last chance to catch up when Boston takes on Detroit in the final scheduled game of the series tomorrow night.

Jimmy Orlando of Detroit ranks as the league's official bad man with a grand total of 95 minutes in the penalty box during the season—85 minutes in majors and minors and one 10-minute misconduct.
